RE: BURBO BANK EXTENSION OFFSHORE WIND FARM ORDER 2014 REQUEST TO VARY THE DEEMED MARINE LICENCE NOISE MONITORING CONDITION DURING THE CONSTRUCTION OF THE OFFSHORE WIND FARM

I can confirm the Marine Management Organisation (MMO) received your request for a variation to the Deemed Marine Licence within Schedule 2 and 3 of The Burbo Bank Extension Offshore Wind Farm Order 2014 (DCO) on 24 February 2015.

As the MMO is responsible for enforcing, post-consent monitoring, varying, suspending, and revoking any deemed marine licence(s) as part of the DCO, the MMO will now proceed to consider the request under [section 72 of the Marine and Coastal Access Act 2009](#). As part of this process the MMO will authorise its right to consult the relevant bodies that the MMO sees fit. It should also be noted that there will be a fee associated with the variation process, which will be issued in writing for the applicant to accept; further information regarding this can be viewed at the link below.
