FREEDOM OF INFORMATION ACT 2000 - REQUEST REF: 0246-16

Thank you for your email of 26 February 2016 asking for information under the Freedom of Information Act (FOIA) 2000. You asked:

“In relation to UK support for the creation of a Strategic Planning Unit within the Tunisian Ministry of Interior, a programme implemented by Aktis Strategy (see <https://www.gov.uk/government/world-location-news/uk-supports-tunisia-security-reform-efforts>):

- 1. Has the Government carried out an OSJA assessment?*
- 2. If so on which date has it been carried out?*
- 3. If applicable, on which dates has the original assessment been reviewed?”*

I am writing to confirm that we have now completed the search for the information which you requested. I can confirm that the Foreign and Commonwealth Office (FCO) does hold information relevant to your request.

I can confirm that an Overseas Security and Justice Assistance assessment (OSJA) was carried out for the implementation by Aktis of the creation of a Strategic Planning Unit within the Tunisian Ministry of Interior. This assessment was carried out on 1 March 2015 and remains current.

Once an FOI request is answered, it is considered to be in the public domain. To promote transparency, we may now publish the response and any material released on gov.uk in the [FOI releases](#) section. All personal information in the letter will be removed before publishing.
