

Pre-Race Start



Training

- On board 4 x5 days
 - Evolutions
 - Team work
 - Safety procedures
- Shore based
 - Day skipper / yacht master theory
 - Sea safety
 - First aid
 - VHF
 - Radar





Life at 45 degrees — racing 24/7






Pollywogs to shellbacks





Exhaustion





Pacific - Day 29 March 31st 2012 05.10

- 400 miles from San Francisco
- 3rd depression in quick succession
- 984mB
- 70 knot winds from starboard rear quarter
- Mainsail 3rd reef
- Pooped by 100 foot wave
- 4 of 5 on deck injured

Damage

- Helm flattened
- Reefing lines blown
- Nik crush to pelvis from binnacle
- Mark trapped in helm, back strain
- Max thrown against coffee grinder, rib injury
- Me rib and vertebral fractures, pneumothorax & ruptured spleen

The Boat comes first.....

- Off watch back on deck
- Risk of capsizing if broadsided
- Emergency tiller & engine
- Casualties below deck
- Make emergency contact by satellite phone (EPIRB lost)
-drop sail

Medevac

- Plane HC130 Hercules 10 hours
- Unable to drop jumper to assess casualties
- Dropped supplies including oxygen and remote monitoring equipment

The Drop



Medevac

'Is she stable?'

- US Coastguard Cutter Bertholf
- 36 hours post incident
- Plan drop swimmer then helicopter airlift
-from the water?

Medevac

- Swimmer not possible
- Conditions still not safe for helicopter airlift from yacht
- Clinical risk of airlift in dry suit from water
- Boat to boat transfer decided
- To RHIB then davit lift onto Cutter

The Medevac



USCG Bertholf



- Arrived Highlands
 Hospital, Oakland 60
 hours post incident
- 7 fractured ribs
- Left pneumothorax
- Ruptured spleen secondary bleed
- 4 fractured TP lumbar vertebrae
- Hospitalised 2 weeks, ITU 5 days
- Flight home 6.5.12

GWA arrives – 12 hours later
