4	Permanent Highways Maintenance	
4.1	Information Paper E14 — Update	
	HS2 Ltd provided an update on the planned update to Information	

Paper E14 to address the following matters:

- Ownership of highways to be stopped-up permanently
- Meaning of the term 'temporary stopping up'
- Future highway maintenance responsibilities
- Powers to take action against any person depositing mud on a road
- Application of New Roads and Street Works Act 1991
- Meaning of the term 'lorry ban orders'
- Recovery of expenses due to extraordinary traffic

HS2 Ltd explained that Information Paper E14 could be updated to clarify other matters as they arise.

Action: HS₂ Ltd to provide a status update on Information Paper E₁₄ at the next meeting #₅.

Buckinghamshire County Council sought clarification on the disapplication of NWSA Sections 54 and 55 and how the process of notifications will work. HS2 Ltd explained that this information will be provided in Information Paper E14 and is a future agenda item at meeting #6.

4.2 Future Highways Maintenance responsibilities

HS2 Ltd presented an indication of the likely content of a planned new Information Paper, which is still under review and subject to alteration. It was explained by HS2 Ltd that the purpose of the new IP is to provide more detail to highway authorities and the Select Committee on the following topics:

- General hybrid bill requirement
- Overbridges
- Viaducts and underbridges
- Tunnels
- Winter maintenance
- Maintenance agreements

HS2 Ltd presented information on future funding of highways maintenance for new highways. It was noted that the New Burdens doctrine will be used to calculate the outcome. HS2 Ltd and DfT are planning to contact a representative sample group of authorities to carry out an exercise to determine current highways maintenance costs. This information gathering process will help to develop an understanding of New Burdens arising from HS2 and the results will be reported to the Subgroup.

The authorities raised some questions with regard to highways maintenance responsibilities:

The Highways Agency asked who was responsible for waterproofing (new rail overbridges) and how this interacts with other aspects of maintenance, such as surface highway maintenance. HS2 Ltd clarified that in most cases the highway authority would be responsible for everything above the waterproofing and within the parapets, below which the nominated undertaker responsible for maintaining / operating the railway would have responsibility.

The Highways Agency also asked who would responsible for railway safety. HS2 Ltd clarified that a nominated undertaker would be responsible for safely maintaining / operating the railway once it is in operation.

LB Brent asked how responsibilities for fixings (such as signage) would be managed and would a workforce be available to remove unwanted items, such as banners etc. HS2 Ltd advised that these matters would be incorporated into the highways maintenance agreement, to be discussed in the Subgroup at the appropriate time.

Staffordshire CC asked who would be responsible for clearing graffiti. HS2 Ltd clarified that it would be the body responsible for maintaining the asset, so if on the parapets it would be a nominated undertaker.

Chair highlighted that the Subgroup will be looking at the highways maintenance agreement in detail, which will help to clarify points raised in the meeting.

Chair asked if authorities could request items to be included in the highways maintenance agreement which do not comply with Information Papers. HS2 Ltd explained that the terms of the Bill are fixed and the outcome of the highways maintenance agreement needs to be consistent with the new Information Paper.

5 Forward Programme

HS2 Ltd presented information to the Subgroup on the future programme and how HS2 Ltd plan to engage with the Subgroup on traffic management matters over the coming years.

A high level HS2 indicative programme was presented to the Subgroup by HS2 Ltd. It was explained that the anticipated Royal Assent date may change and overall programme would be shifted to reflect the change.

The Highways Agency enquired as to the timeframes for the HS2 Ltd general procurement process and Early Contractor Involvement. HS2 Ltd summarised the process and assumed timeframes as stated at: https://www.gov.uk/high-speed-2/business

The Highways Agency asked when the Nominated Undertaker will start to occupy their assets. They noted that this information would help inform their resourcing plans. HS2 Ltd indicated that at this stage HS2 Ltd cannot comment on detailed programme / notifications and that the relevant procedures are emerging to be discussed with the Subgroup.

HS2 Ltd also presented a document route map, a draft programme for traffic management engagement and a forward programme for the Subgroup. HS2 Ltd clarified that 'Technical Standards Feedback' relates to the Rural Roads Design Guide.

Action: HS2 Ltd to amend the forward programme to include the CoCP as an agenda item in May and move protective provisions to the June meeting.

HS2 Ltd noted that feedback form the highway authorities on the Rural Road Design Criteria had been collated by Chiltern DC and sent to HS2 Ltd. Hs2 Ltd is currently reviewing comments and will respond to the Subgroup at a future meeting. HS2 Ltd sought clarification from the Subgroup about comments received relating to duties highway authorities have under the Highways Act 1980. Hertfordshire CC advised the comments didn't relate to specific part of the act but was a general comment.

TfL raised the matter of vulnerable road users and how this relates to the CoCP and protective provisions. They requested a separate session on the matter. HS2 Ltd explained that this matter is likely to be addressed in the route wide traffic management plan and that industry workshops were being considered to gather and share information on how to approach to the matter. London Borough of Camden enquired as to whether HS2 Ltd should be considering CLOC's as a mechanism. HS2 Ltd noted this.

HS2 Ltd informed the Subgroup that the Highways Subgroup Webpages are now live to allow access to meeting material. Chiltern DC asked whether there is a facility to provide automatic updates when Information Papers are updated.

Action: HS₂ Ltd to enquire as to whether this facility is available or could be made available.

HS2 Ltd informed the Subgroup that authorities may be contacted to provide information on weak bridges and protected assets in their respective areas.
