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Information request

For each of the years 2009 & 2010 how many applications for ESA did you receive as a result of Fibromyalgia and how many were successful.

DWP response

Under the Employment Support Allowance regime, new claimants undergo the Work Capability Assessment. The medical condition recorded on the claim form does not itself confer entitlement to Employment Support Allowance. So a decision on entitlement for a customer claiming Employment Support Allowance (ESA) on the basis of Fibromyalgia would be based on their ability to carry out the range of activities assessed by the Work Capability Assessment; or on the effects of any associated mental health problems. It is also important to note that where someone has more than one diagnosis or disabling condition, only the predominant one is currently recorded.

Causes of incapacity are based on the International Classification of Diseases, 10th Revision, published by the World Health Organisation.

The table below provides the Work Capability Assessment outcomes for all new ESA claims received between October 2008 and May 2010 (the latest data available), where Fibromyalgia is recorded as the main health condition.
