- 4) In how many cases were charges brought?
- 5) In how many cases was a member of the armed forces convicted?
- 6) In how many cases did a conviction result in a member of the armed forces being placed on the sexual offenders register?
- 7) The above information for 2015
- 8) The same for 2014
- *9) The same for 2013*
- 10) The same for 2012

resolution is not possible and you are still dissatisfied then you may apply for an independent internal review by contacting the Information Rights Compliance team, 1st Floor, MOD Main Building, Whitehall, SW1A 2HB (e-mail CIO-FOI-IR@mod.uk). Please note that any request for an internal review must be made within 40 working days of the date on which the attempt to reach informal resolution has come to an end.

If you remain dissatisfied following an internal review, you may take your complaint to the Information Commissioner under the provisions of Section 50 of the Freedom of Information Act. Please note that the Information Commissioner will not investigate your case until the MOD internal review process has been completed.
