Incapacity Benefit is exportable within the EEA, Switzerland and certain Reciprocal Agreement (RA) countries for example, USA, Jamaica for an indefinite period of time, subject to medical controls. For all other countries, the Persons Abroad Regulations apply. Under the Persons Abroad Regulations, IB can be paid for 26 weeks after the customer leaves the UK, provided the absence is temporary and either: the customer has gone abroad for the specific purpose of receiving treatment for an incapacity that began before he or she left the UK, or the customer was continuously incapable of work for at least 6 months prior to the date that he or she left the UK, and has been continuously incapable of work since then.
