Henley Royal Regatta practice and Henley Women's Regatta

Directions for navigation and mooring during this event:

- During these dates (whilst practice for Henley Royal Regatta and Henley Women's Regatta is taking place) **no boats**, other than rowing racing boats, can navigate within the regatta course booms or crew warm up area.
- The navigation channel for river traffic will be on the Bucks. side of the regatta course. Normal rules of navigation will apply in the navigation channel and boats must navigate with particular care and caution.
- Any boat may cross the regatta course and crew warm up area from one side of the river to the other as long as rowing racing boats are not impeded or obstructed.
- No boat can moor to the bank in the area known as The Narrows or to the adjacent regatta course booms (The Narrows is indicated with an X on the map overleaf).
- Only open boats and unpowered boats can moor to the booms on the outside of the regatta course except in the area known as The Narrows. No boat can moor unattended to the regatta course booms, piles or boxes.

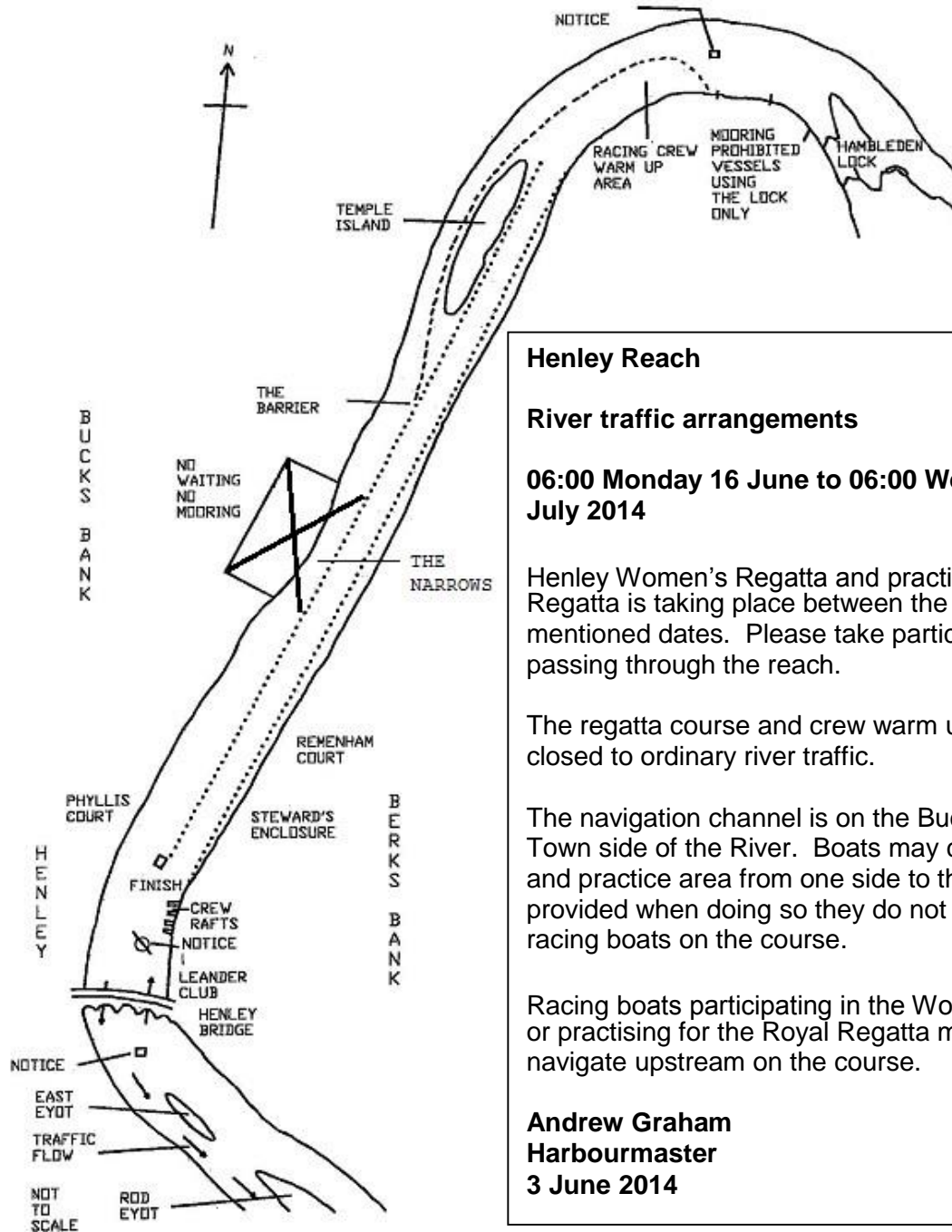

River traffic arrangements

06:00 Monday 16 June to 06:00 Wednesday 2 July 2014

Henley Women's Regatta and practice for the Royal Regatta is taking place between the above mentioned dates. Please take particular care when passing through the reach.

The regatta course and crew warm up area is closed to ordinary river traffic.

The navigation channel is on the Bucks./Henley Town side of the River. Boats may cross the course and practice area from one side to the other provided when doing so they do not interfere with racing boats on the course.

Racing boats participating in the Women's Regatta or practising for the Royal Regatta may only navigate upstream on the course.
