





# **Animal Feed Statistics for Great Britain - April 2016**

## **Key points**

- Please note April 2016 is a 5 week reporting period and therefore direct comparisons with April 2015 and earlier years should not be made as these were 4 week reporting periods.
- Over the crop year from July to April, animal feed production was up 3.3% for pigs and 3.0% for poultry, down 1.6% for sheep and 4.4% for cattle compared to the previous crop year.
- Over the crop year from July to April, wheat used to produce animal feed was up 1.1% and 4.5% for barley compared to the previous crop year. See figure 1.2

### **Usage of the Statistics**

The UK government and the European Commission use these statistics to monitor and assess stocks of cereals as a key component of our food security. The estimates contribute to the UK cereal balance sheets published by the Agricultural and Horticultural Development Board AHDB. Animal feed processors and grain traders use the estimates to help assess market conditions and inform business decisions.

#### Revisions

We have reviewed some IPU's (Integrated Poultry Units) which produce both feed for their own use and feed for retail sale. We have adjusted the data from August which has resulted in an increase in compound poultry feed and a decrease in IPU feed.

- 1. Data are from Defra's monthly animal feed surveys which cover all animal feed processors and integrated poultry units in Great Britain.

## Compound animal feed prices - key points

- The quarterly average price of Cattle and Calf compounds between January and March 2016 was £201 per tonne
- The quarterly average price of Pig compounds between January and March 2016 was £209 per tonne
- The quarterly average price of Poultry compounds between January and March 2016 was £219 per tonne
- The quarterly average price of Sheep compounds between January and March 2016 was £200 per tonne
