As you did not collect statistics for crisis loans made by reason of benefit delay in the first quarter of tax year beginning April 2012, would it be possible for you to send me numbers of crisis loans awarded for "alignment payments".

1. The information provided is Management Information. Our preference is to answer all Parliamentary Questions using Official / National Statistics but in this case we only have Management Information available. It is not quality assured to the same extent as Official / National statistics and there are some issues with the data, for example, it does not

include applications that were withdrawn or applications which were processed clerically and have not yet been entered on to the Social Fund Computer System.

- 2. In 2012/13, Crisis Loans requested under the category "capital not realisable" were reclassified from Crisis Loans for Living Expenses to Crisis Loans for Alignment. "Capital not realisable" loans are made when the applicant requires help until they can access capital assets or arrange credit facilities. These figures are not included in the above figures.
- 3. The figures for awards are not the same as the number of people who received awards. Some people may have made more than one application.
- 4. All figures are rounded to the nearest 100.
- 5. Figures may not sum due to rounding.
