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Additional funding to meet the costs of implementing welfare reform changes in 2012/13

Introduction

- This circular is to inform you of additional funding of £14.8m that has been secured to support the costs of implementing welfare reform changes in 2012/13.
- 2. The funding is intended to meet "New Burdens" incurred by local authorities (LAs) as a result of the implementation of the following areas of welfare reform:
 - a. Implementation of changes to Local Housing Allowance (LHA) (including the move to an annual uprating cycle and changes to the Shared Accommodation Rate)
 - b. Implementation of the social sector size criteria
 - c. Changes to Information Technology (IT) systems for both a. and b.
 - d. Implementation of the benefit cap

Details

3. Although you will receive a single payment, to provide transparency we provide a breakdown of the total funding below.

- 4. This funding is intended to meet the identified costs arising from the introduction of the above measures in 2012/13. In the case of LHA changes, for example, it is intended primarily to meet the costs of additional applications for Discretionary Housing Payments. But it is, of course, for local decision what aspects of the additional administrative costs you actually spend it on.
- Each element of the funding has been distributed amongst LAs on a basis that reflects the likely distribution of costs, as indicated in the table above.
 The aggregate allocations are included in the attached appendix A.
- 6. Each LA will receive a single payment on or around 30 January 2013.
- 7. Funding for 2013/14 and beyond will be subject of discussions with the LA Associations. We will continue to assess the ongoing impact of welfare reforms on LA administration in line with the New Burdens Doctrine.

Further Changes

8. Further changes to your IT systems are in the process of being developed (to support the delivery of the benefit cap and to ensure you are aware of new Personal Independence Payment awards), we expect to issue a further payment to you once your suppliers have completed this work.
