Thank you for your e-mail 15 December 2016 of asking for information about Reaper. You requested the following information:

- "1. The number of Reaper UAV aircraft/airframes in service each year since 2007?
- 2. The number of Reaper flying hours each year since 2007?"

I am treating your correspondence as a request for information under the Freedom of Information Act 2000. I am writing to confirm that we hold information on the subject you have requested.

The number of Reaper aircraft/airframes in service with the RAF as at 1 January per year is given in the table below. Reaper came into operational service in October 2007.

Flying hours by calendar year are given in the table below. They are rounded to the nearest ten.

The data in this table is extracted from live administrative systems held by the Air Warfare Centre (AWC). Please note that any request for an internal review must be made within 40 working days of the date on which the attempt to reach informal resolution has come to an end.

If you remain dissatisfied following an internal review, you may take your complaint to the Information Commissioner under the provisions of Section 50 of the Freedom of Information Act. Please note that the Information Commissioner will not investigate your case until the MOD internal review process has been completed.
