Thank you for your email dated 29 March 2015. You asked:

I ... would like to understand the Equipment Asset Code system for C vehicles, and would it be possible to supply me with a list of all C vehicles.

I am treating your email as a request for information in accordance with the Freedom of Information Act 2000. A search for the information has now been completed within the Ministry of Defence (MOD), and I can confirm that information in scope of your request is held.

The MOD prime asset register for Registered Number Equipment (RNE) is a management information system known as JAMES. RNE is a term used to cover all assets that have an Equipment Registration Mark also known as a number plate: primarily vehicles but can also apply to other assets such as trailers, box bodies, generators and water craft.

Please find attached a list of C vehicles. This is data that is available from the JAMES Portal website http://www.james-project.r.mil.uk/index.html and is an extract of the JAMES Managed Equipments (JME) list that can be found half way down on the front page.

You may also be interested to know that we received a similar request in January this year about B vehicles and how Asset Codes are constructed. This response was published on the MOD internet site during the week commencing 12 January 2015. The link is:

The documents concerned are the last three on that list.

If you are not satisfied with this response or you wish to complain about any aspect of the handling of your request, then you should contact me in the first instance. If informal resolution is not possible and you are still dissatisfied then you may apply for an independent internal review by contacting the Information Rights Compliance team, 1st Floor, MOD Main Building, Whitehall, SW1A 2HB (e-mail CIO-FOI-IR@mod.uk). Please note that any request for an internal review must be made within 40 working days of the date on which the attempt to reach informal resolution has come to an end.

If you remain dissatisfied following an internal review, you may take your complaint to the Information Commissioner under the provisions of Section 50 of the Freedom of Information Act. Please note that the Information Commissioner will not investigate your case until the MOD internal review process has been completed.
