How often does DWP require life certification from pensioners living overseas?

The current strategy is to issue a life certificate on a regular basis to customers. The life certificate is one of a number of methods used by the Department to ensure that the correct payment is made to the correct person.

I hope you understand that the very nature of the Life Certification process, to ensure correct payments are made, means that I am unable to go into detail about the process we use, as this could potentially jeopardise the effectiveness of this measure. I can confirm that if a life certificate isn't promptly returned, this can lead to the suspension or closure of a claim to UK State pension.

The Department for Work and Pensions has a responsibility to protect the public purse and that the completion of Life Certificates is one of a series of

measures used by DWP to ensure the accuracy of benefit payments to overseas customers.
