FREEDOM OF INFORMATION ACT 2000 REQUEST REF: 0020-16

Thank you for your email of 6 January 2016 asking for information under the Freedom of Information Act (FOIA) 2000. You asked:

Under the Freedom of Information Act, I would like to seek access to the following records which I believe are held by the Foreign and Commonwealth Office (FCO):

-copies of all correspondence, including electronic and written correspondence, between the FCO and the Irish government which refer to Isis and/or Isil and/or the Islamic State and/or IS and/or Daesh exchanged in the last two years

My preferred form of access is electronic via the email address supplied below, or whatever is most convenient for you.

I am writing to confirm that we have now completed the search for the information which you requested.

I can confirm that the Foreign and Commonwealth Office (FCO) does hold information relevant to your request, which we have attached.

This is the only piece of correspondence between the UK government and the Irish government that falls within the remit of your request.

Some of the withheld information is personal data relating to third parties. It is our view that disclosure of this information would breach the first data protection principle, which states that personal data should be processed fairly and lawfully. Section 40(2) and (3) of the Freedom of Information Act therefore apply. It is the fairness aspect of this principle which we think would be breached by disclosure in this case. In such circumstances section 40 confers an absolute exemption on disclosure. We do not therefore have to apply the public interest test.

Once an FOI request is answered, it is considered to be in the public domain. To promote transparency, we may now publish the response and any material released on gov.uk in the [FOI releases](#) section. All personal information in the letter will be removed before publishing.
