Thank you for your email of 13 August 2015 which requested the following information:-

*'I would like to know what current estimate the Ministry of Defence has made of the number of ISIS combatants killed as a result of UK airstrikes against ISIS targets in Iraq.*

*If these estimates are available, I would like to know them for the period covering present day back to 26th September 2014.*

*If this information is available, I would like to request copies of this research in either paper or portable document format (PDF).'*

Your correspondence has been treated as a request for information under the Freedom of Information Act 2000 (FOIA).

A search for the information has now been completed within the Ministry of Defence, and we can confirm that all of the information in scope of your request is held. The information you have requested can be found below.

The number of ISIL combatants killed in RAF airstrikes in Iraq from September 2014 to 31 August 2015.

Please be aware that the figures for enemy combatants killed by RAF airstrikes have not been verified because the UK can not visit strike sites and conduct detailed investigations on the ground such that the numbers of deaths can be categorically determined. They are estimated figures only.

If you are not satisfied with this response or you wish to complain about any aspect of the handling of your request, then you should contact this office in the first instance. Please note that any request for an internal review must be made within 40 working days of the date on which the attempt to reach informal resolution has come to an end.

If you remain dissatisfied following an internal review, you may take your complaint to the Information Commissioner under the provisions of Section 50 of the Freedom of Information Act. Please note that the Information Commissioner will not investigate your case until the MOD internal review process has been completed.
