Thank you for your email dated 19 January 2015 in which you request the following information:

'I am a student from the University of South Wales which is currently running a project on maintenance costing due to Foreign Object Damage. I have been seeking information regarding financial cost among military aircraft due to FOD but could not find any.

Could you please provide the maintenance cost incurred during fiscal year 2012/2013 or 2013/2014 among UK military aviation, and also standard publications they refer to regarding FOD prevention for each service.'

I am treating your correspondence as a request for information under the Freedom of Information Act 2000.

A search for the information has now been completed within the Ministry of Defence and I can confirm that information in scope of your request is held.

The information you have requested can be found attached. Under Section 16 of the Act (Advice and Assistance) you may find it helpful to note that we have interpreted your request as referring to damage arising from foreign objects located externally (e.g. in the airfield or hangar), rather than loose article hazards within the aircraft itself.

If you are not satisfied with this response or you wish to complain about any aspect of the handling of your request, then you should contact me in the first instance. If informal resolution is not possible and you are still dissatisfied then you may apply for an independent internal review by contacting the Information Rights Compliance team, 1st Floor, MOD Main Building, Whitehall, SW1A 2HB (e-mail CIO-FOI-IR@mod.uk). Please note that any request for an internal review must be made within 40 working days of the date on which the attempt to reach informal resolution has come to an end.

If you remain dissatisfied following an internal review, you may take your complaint to the Information Commissioner under the provisions of Section 50 of the Freedom of Information Act. Please note that the Information Commissioner will not investigate your case until the MOD internal review process has been completed.
