Your request for the names and post titles of MOD officials engages the absolute exemption, Section 40 (Personal Information) and are withheld under the Act. However, all JSPs are owned by a relevant Defence Authority who is ultimately responsible for the publication. For information related JSPs this is the Ministry of Defence's Chief Digital and Information Officer (CDIO), Mike Stone. DIANs are also approved by CDIO.

If you are not satisfied with this response or you wish to complain about any aspect of the handling of your request, then you should contact me in the first instance. If informal resolution is not possible and you are still dissatisfied then you may apply for an independent internal review by contacting the Information Rights Compliance team, 1st Floor, MOD Main Building, Whitehall, SW1A 2HB (e-mail CIO-FOI-IR@mod.uk). Please note that any request for an internal review must be made within 40 working days of the date on which the attempt to reach informal resolution has come to an end.

If you remain dissatisfied following an internal review, you may take your complaint to the Information Commissioner under the provisions of Section 50 of the Freedom of Information Act. Please note that the Information Commissioner will not investigate your case until the MOD internal review process has been completed.
