





Cereals usage by Millers, Brewers, Distillers and Maltsters UK - September 2015

Key points

- Milling industry, starch and Bioethanol used 592 thousand tonnes of wheat in September 2015, down 7.7% on September 2014. Of this 502 thousand tonnes was home produced.
- Brewers, maltsters and distillers used 142 thousand tonnes of barley in September 2015, down 12% on September 2014.
- Brewers, maltsters and distillers used 59 thousand tonnes of wheat in September 2015, down 17% on September 2014.
- Crop year to date (2015/16) home grown wheat milled has increased by 5.3% on July to Sept 2014, imported wheat milled has declined 38% on the July to Sept 2014. See figure 1.

- Home grown wheat used for milling was down 4.6% to 502 thousand tonnes against September 2014. Imported wheat used for milling was down 22% to 90 thousand tonnes.
- Barley used for brewing, malting and distilling was down 12% to 142 thousand tonnes against September 2014. Wheat was also down by 17% to 59 thousand tonnes on September 2014.
- Oat usage was up 5.6% to 125 thousand tonnes against September 2014.

Usage of the Statistics

The UK government and the European Commission use these statistics to monitor and assess stocks of cereals as a key component of our food security. The estimates contribute to the UK cereal balance sheets published by the Agricultural and Horticultural Development Board AHDB. Grain processors and traders use the estimates to help assess market conditions.

Revisions

There is an element of estimation in the brewers maltsters and distillers data and in the flour milling data for September.
