## Site description:

Little whirlpool ram's horn snail *Anisus vorticulus* occurs across a range of sites in southern and eastern England. The Arun valley is one of the three main population centres for this species in the UK.

This proposed site includes two of its core sites in the wash lands of the Arun floodplain (Pulborough Brooks and Amberley Wild Brooks SSSIs). Both sites are comprised of a series of wet meadows dissected by a network of ditches. Within the Arun valley these two SSSIs have had the strongest and most consistent presence of *Anisus vorticulus*.

**Qualifying species:** The site is designated under **article 4(4)** of the Directive (92/43/EEC) as it hosts the following species listed in Annex II:
