

## Vision Studio School – impact assessment

The Impact Assessment is an Enhanced one.

### Secondary schools with a high rating

Queen Elizabeth's Academy's distance from the proposed studio school site is less than the average distance for pupil journeys to

secondary school in Mansfield District (1.2 miles) so, in principal, the school is likely to lose more pupils to the new studio school than schools further away. Additionally, it has attainment below the national average and an Inadequate Ofsted reference so parents/pupils may be attracted to an alternative. The school was undersubscribed for entry in 2012 and had an overall surplus of places of 289. Queen Elizabeth do not offer engineering as a specialism and are looking at potentially removing their health and social care offer at post 16, so the current curriculum on offer at the Studio School is different to the curriculum pathways on offer within the School.

The Manor school has attainment below the national average and only a Requires Improvement Ofsted reference so parents/pupils may be attracted to an alternative. The school was undersubscribed for entry in 2012 and had an overall surplus of places of 303. Manor is a specialist Sports College offering engineering qualifications at both KS4 and KS5, but do not offer health and social care. The vocational qualifications are significantly smaller size than the qualifications offered at the Studio School.

For both schools, the loss of even a few pupils could exacerbate the existing surplus issue and there could be a significant impact on overall attainment, viability and ability to improve. It is unlikely that any negative impact will be mitigated by an increased demand for school places in the local area as the LA District school population in the 14-19 age range is projected to decline over the next few years.
