**FREEDOM OF INFORMATION ACT 2000 REQUEST REF: FOI 1065-16**

Thank you for your email of 14 November 2016 asking for information under the Freedom of Information Act (FOIA) 2000. You asked:

*With regards to the British Island of Diego Garcia, what records does HMG hold from 1 January 2004 to 30 June 2004 relating to US administration flights? Please provide me with a schedule describing the different kinds of records and documents that HMG holds.*

I am writing to confirm that we have now completed the search for the information which you requested.

I can confirm that the Foreign and Commonwealth Office (FCO) does hold information relevant to your request.

We hold a range of movement records for the requested time period in both hard copy and digital formats covering flights into and out of Diego Garcia. The following are the types of records we hold:

- General Declarations
- Passenger Manifests
- Monthly Statistics Logs
- Daily Logs
- Immigration Arrival Cards
- Closeout Status Reports
- Customs-related documents
- Other Manifests

Once an FOI request is answered, it is considered to be in the public domain. To promote transparency, we may now publish the response and any material released on [gov.uk](http://gov.uk) in the [FOI releases](#) section. All personal information in the letter will be removed before publishing.
