If you have chlamydia you will be given antibiotics to treat the infection. The people you have had sex with recently should also be tested.

It is a good idea to get tested again about 3 months after you finish your treatment. This is because it's been shown that people who have chlamydia once are more likely to get it again, and repeat infections increase the risk of developing serious health consequences. Following a positive test for chlamydia, you may be contacted again about the option of getting re-tested.
