12.00 Monday 6 July to 06.00 Friday 24 July 2015 De-construction of the Henley Royal Regatta course

Directions for navigation and mooring during these dates:

Those in charge of all boats in this vicinity must conform with these directions and with any special directions which, at the discretion of a Harbourmaster, may be required in particular circumstances during these dates.

While the Henley Royal Regatta course is being dismantled, the following restrictions apply to **all boats** navigating between Henley Bridge and the downstream end of Temple Island (except from 07.00 on Friday 10 July to 18.00 on Saturday 11 July, between 08.00 and 15.00 on Sunday 12 July and from 09.00 on Saturday 18 to 18.00 on Sunday 19 July):

- All boats travelling downstream must navigate within the regatta course booms from the regatta finish to the barrier.
- All boats travelling upstream must navigate on the Buckinghamshire/Fawley side of the regatta course.
- Any boat can cross the course from one side of the river to the other provided they do not obstruct other boats or impede the regatta being held on the 10 and 11 July or the swim event on Sunday 12 July.
- No boats can moor within the regatta course, to the bank in the area known as The Narrows or to the adjacent regatta course booms (The Narrows is indicated with an X on the map overleaf).
- No boats can moor unaftended to the regatta course booms, piles or boxes.
- During the dismantling of the regatta course please take particular care when passing through the reach.

Exceptions

- On Friday 10 and Saturday 11 July the Henley Masters Regatta is being held, on Sunday 12 July the Henley Mile Swim is being held and the regatta course will be closed to all boats except participants.
- On Saturday 18 July and Sunday 19 July the navigation channel for boats travelling both up and downstream will be along the regatta course on the Berks/Remenham side of the river as the Thames Traditional Boat Festival will be taking place on the Bucks/Fawley side of the regatta course.

It is an offence to fail to conform with the directions in this notice or to obstruct an officer of the Environment Agency in the execution of their duty or to fail to obey directions given regarding the navigation, mooring or unmooring of any boat.

Furthermore, we hereby advise that the regatta course including all of the piles, booms and boxes are the property of Henley Royal Regatta. The Regatta may choose to take civil action against any person who causes damage to their structures.
