Thank you for your email of 30 January 2015 requesting the following information:

"Details of meetings (MOD briefing papers, agendas, minutes), correspondence (emails, letters), including the terms of reference for the reports, between senior MOD officials and / or senior officials at Defence Estates senior executives / consultants at the Grontmij Group, concerning the report into MOD Shoeburyness - Fleet - Phase 2 Land Quality Assessment - Prioritised Areas, published in May 2009 from 1st January 2009 until 31 May 2009,"

I am treating your correspondence as a request for information under the Freedom of Information Act 2000 (FOIA).

I am writing to confirm that Ministry of Defence (MOD) holds information on the subject you have requested.

The information you have requested can be found at Annex A and Annex B, but some of the information falls within scope of the absolute exemption Section 40 (Personal Data).

Section 40 (2) has been applied to some of the information in order to protect personal information as governed by the Data Protection Act 1998. Section 40 is an absolute exemption and there is therefore no requirement to consider the public interest in making a decision to withhold the information.

Please note that in Annex B any information not in scope of the above request has been removed.
