Please also provide a breakdown of those figures, to include the number of claimants and the length of time they been receiving support – one year or less, one-to-two years, twoto-three years, three-to-four years, four-to-five years, five-to-ten years, ten-to-20 years and 20 years or more.

Please note that Incapacity Benefit (IB) was replaced by Employment and Support Allowance (ESA) for new claims from October 2008.
