The Secretary of State for the Department for Environment, Food and Rural Affairs, by this authorisation issued under Regulation 15(5) of the Trade in Animals and Related Products Regulations 2011 hereby authorises the landing in England, in accordance with the conditions set out below:

Gelatine capsules derived from species other than of the bovine, ovine and
caprine species containing products of animal origin* that do not require
veterinary checks at a Border Inspection Posts or other substances not
subject to checks at Border Inspection posts.

*this authorisation cannot be used for meat products/powders/concentrates/extracts which must be subject to veterinary checks

From

The product of animal origin (POAO) must

- Come from a country that is listed in Commission Decision 2011/163/EC as amended from which that POAO is permitted.
- Come from a country listed in Regulation (EU) No 605/2010 and have been processed according to the requirements in that Regulation (only applies to milk products)

The gelatine can come from any third country

At

Any point of entry in England

Port of Entry

Until further notice or unless revoked by the Secretary of State

CONDITIONS ATTACHED TO THIS AUTHORISATION

- 1. Each consignment must be accompanied by a declaration signed by the manufacturer confirming that the gelatine is not derived from animals of the bovine, ovine or caprine species.
- 2. Gelatine capsules must comply with the relevant provisions set down in Regulation (EC) No 178/2002, laying down the general principles and requirements of food law and laying down procedures in matters of food safety.

NOTES

- a. Nothing in this authorisation gives exemption from any prohibition or restriction imposed by the EU or in any other legislation, including: the provisions of the Food Safety Act 1990 and Regulations made under it, the Animal By-Products (Enforcement) (England) Regulations 2013, the Marketing Authorisations for Veterinary Medicinal Products Regulations 1994, or by any regulation superseding or amending the same.
- b. This is not a Department for Business, Energy & Industrial Strategy (BEIS) licence and gives no exemption from any prohibition, regulation or restriction imposed by BEIS.
- c. This authorisation is granted under animal health import legislation and gives no exemption from any prohibition, regulation or restriction imposed by any other Government Department or Agency.
- d. Please note that this authorisation is current at the time of its issue. Importers should check with APHA to ensure conditions for import have not changed.
- e. Any products imported under this authorisation and associated paperwork shall be made available if so required for inspection by an Officer of the Animal and Plant Health Agency at any place nominated by him/her for such inspection. The importer or his agent shall afford all assistance necessary to such an officer to enable him/her to carry out the inspection in such a manner as he/she shall determine and the importer shall be responsible for meeting any costs of carrying out such an inspection

CAUTION

It is the importer's responsibility to ensure that any import covered by this authorisation complies with the terms and conditions as set out.

Any breach of any conditions attached to this authorisation will constitute an offence against the Animal Health Act 1981.
