It was good hearing from you at the Devolution Unit event yesterday. I mentioned to you at the end of your session about the plan for our Cabinet Secretary for Economy, Jobs and Fair Work, Keith Brown, coming over to Germany to undertake a trade and investment focused visit. I've now been advised by the Cabinet Secretary's private office that they are looking to:

- fly out to Berlin on Sunday 5th March;
- undertake meetings/engagements in Berlin on Monday 6th;
- fly to Munich on Monday night or early Tuesday morning;
- have one or two meetings/engagements in Munich on Tuesday 7th;
- fly back to Edinburgh on Tuesday 7th in the afternoon or early evening.

We have had initial discussions with our SDI colleagues and they are considering a number of potential meetings / engagements which would provide the T&I focus that Mr Brown requested. In the meantime, I've set out below a list of some of the options we thought might be good to build in around the T&I commitments:

- a meeting with a member of the German Federal Government;
- a meeting with a chair of a Bundestag committee relevant to the Cabinet Secretary's portfolio;
- a round table discussion with the Association of German Chambers of Commerce and Industry. (an approach has already been made from the Chambers of Commerce to the Scottish Government on this).

I'd be grateful for any advice / help you can provide with regards to this visit. You mentioned that the Bundestag has particular 'sitting weeks', could you please confirm whether the 6th of March is a sitting week?

You'll have seen my initial email to Nick with regards to Mr Brown's visit to Germany from 5-7 March. Since then I've had a further discussion with the Cabinet Secretary's Private Secretary, so I can now shed a bit more light on what we are looking for. The PS confirmed that the Cabinet Secretary will be available for meetings/engagements between late Sunday afternoon and Tuesday Morning. Mr Brown needs to be back in Parliament by late afternoon on Tuesday, therefore, we'll need to have him fly out by lunchtime on Tuesday. I'd have thought that it would be difficult to arrange a meeting/engagement for Sunday evening, although you'll know better than me if this is the case. It would be really appreciated if you were able to help us arrange the meetings with the Federal Government Ministers and the Committee Chair. It would also be helpful if you would consider whether there are any good opportunities Mr Brown could undertake while in Munich.

On the point of Munich, The Cabinet Secretary's Private Secretary suggested that Mr Brown is not fixed on the idea of going to Munich and would be willing to go elsewhere if it were

considered a better option. When I spoke with Nick on Wednesday he suggested Hamburg may be a good option for a visit. Before we go into the details of the programme, I just wanted to confirm timings. I did a quick search on flights and it looks like there is no direct flight from Edinburgh to Berlin on a Sunday. However there is a flight to **Hamburg** with Easyjet, leaving 13:25 which gets in at 16:10.

Hamburg is an attractive option for a 2 city visit. It is Germany's second largest city, a major port and the centre of the wind industry which is so important in German energy policy. It is a growing city, with corresponding pressures on infrastructure. For example, it aims to build 10,000 new apartments each year of which 3,000 are to be state subsidised affordable housing. Our best option would be to arrange a dinner for Sunday evening, but at this stage need to manage expectations about whether or not this will be possible.

Monday morning could be spent visiting the port. plans to deepen it have been paused following legal appeal by environmental groups but we would try for a meeting with the Mayor of Hamburg or a Member of the Senate. The 157 Ha HafenCity is one of Europe's largest regeneration programmes. Hamburg has aspirations to become a carbon neutral port and


