

# Non-association independent schools inspections and outcomes: frequency of publication of statistics

Consultation document

Ofsted is proposing to change the frequency of publishing statistics on inspections and outcomes for non-association independent schools. Our proposals include publishing management information on a regular basis.

Through this consultation, we are seeking the widest possible range of views to make sure that any revision we make takes into account the needs and circumstances of all those who have an interest or expertise in non-association schools. We are particularly keen to hear from people who have been directly involved with schools – including children, parents and carers and those who run and commission services.



#### **About Ofsted**

1. The Office for Standards in Education, Children's Services and Skills (Ofsted) regulates and inspects to achieve excellence in the care of children and young people and in education and skills for learners of all ages.

## Purpose and background to the consultation

- 2. We are asking for your views on our proposed changes to the publication frequency of 'Non-association independent schools: inspections and outcomes' official statistics' and aslo providing additional management information on a regular basis. Your contribution will help us refine the frequency of our statistics to better meet users' needs.
- 3. The official statistics is currently published twice a year on the gov.uk website: www.gov.uk/government/collections/independent-schools-inspections-and-outcomes and reports on the most recent inspection outcomes of all schools open and the outcomes of inspections in the academic year to date.
- 4. Ofsted does not currently publish management information for non-association independent schools. These proposals set out our intentions to publish these on a regular basis.
- 5. Data produced as a result of these proposals may also be quoted in various Ofsted communications, such as speeches, blogs, conferences, surveys, letters, and HMCI's Annual Report.
- 6. These proposals only affect the reporting of inspection outcomes. They do not affect the timing of a school's inspection, or the data that is used in the inspection.

## The aim of the consultation

- 7. The aim of this consultation is to find out how Ofsted can make the release of statistics for non-association schools more timely and user-friendly.
- 8. Responses will inform the review of the frequency of publication. The consultation closes on **14 September 2017** and results will be published in October 2017.

# **Proposals**

- 9. We are proposing the following change to the non-association independent schools releases, namely:
  - reducing the number of releases of official statistics from twice to once per year



- publishing additional management information on non-association independent schools three times each year.
- 10. Our official statistics are currently published twice a year, in July (which covers the period from September to March) and November (which covers the full academic year from September to August). The official statistics report on the most recent inspection outcomes of all schools open and the outcomes of inspections in the academic year to date.
- 11. We are proposing to remove the release of official statistics in July. Instead, we will replace this with regular releases of management information throughout the year.
- 12. This change would result in the following release schedule each year:
  - management information published in January/February (on inspections conducted from the previous September to December, plus the most recent inspection outcomes of all open schools at the end of December)
  - management information published in April/May (on inspections conducted from September to March, plus the most recent inspection outcomes of all open schools at the end of March)
  - management information published in August/September (on inspections conducted from September to July, plus the most recent inspection outcomes of all open schools at the end of July)
  - official statistics published in November/December (which would cover inspections conducted from September to August including those published in September, plus the most recent inspection outcomes of all open schools at the end of August).
- 13. Publishing data in this way will make the release of data more timely, and therefore more readily accessible.

## The consultation process

- 14. We welcome your responses to this consultation paper. The consultation opens on 20 July 2017 and closes on 14 September 2017.
- 15. The information you give us will inform our consideration of the frequency of publication of official statistics and management information for non-association independent schools.
- 16. We will publish a report on the response to this consultation in October 2017.
