All dailies: His Majesty King Hamad bin Isa Al-Khalifa, in the presence of His Royal Highness Prince Salman bin Hamad Al Khalifa, yesterday at the Safriya Palace, received former Prime Minister of the United Kingdom, David Cameron. His Royal Highness Prince Salman bin Hamad Al -Khalifa, Crown

Prince, Deputy Supreme Commander and First Deputy Prime Minister, last might met with Cameron at Riffa Palace. HM the King highlighted the UK's active role in the international arena and its contributions to maintaining security and stability in the region and the world.

The Crown Prince welcomed the longstanding ties between Bahrain and the UK, stressing the importance of the wide-ranging cooperation between the two countries. Cameron also visited the Headquarters of Bahrain Economic Development Board (EDB) and met with CEO Khalid Al-Romaihi. Al-Romaihi affirmed Bahrain is pushing forward with efforts to diversify the national economy, and that the EDB's strategic plan focuses on the development of the targeted economic sectors that form a competitive advantage for the Kingdom of Bahrain.
