



WFP Sudan Otash IDP Camp

December 2016

Background

In August 2004, the Otash camp for the internally displaced was established in the Nyala locality. The camp hosts 75,274 protracted internally displace persons (IDPs) and 5,938 new arrivals.

IDPs originate from the following villages: Elghoz Elgharbi, Muhajeria, Labado, Um Gonya, Hijier, Marla, Heriga, Donkey Derissa, Halouf, Yara, Shadida, Duma, Adwa, Malam, Um Dokhon and Delige. And the IDP population is predominantly from the Fur and Brigit tribes, representing 50% of the population, while the other 50% include the Zaghawa, Dinka, Tama and Misseria Jabal tribes.

Verification Analysis

In June 2011, the verification of protracted IDPs took place and in April 2014 for 2013/14 new arrivals.

The revision of the IDP caseload led to a 23% reduction from pre-verification figure of

71,439 to the post-verification figure of 56,530.

And in September 2015, the IDP profiling resulted in 8% caseload reduction.

Programmatic Response

- In Otash camp, WFP provides general food assistance, through cash based transfers to 75,200 individuals. WFP also provides inkind food assistance to 5,938 inddividuals displaced from the Jebel Marra area since April 2016.
- Nutritional assistance is provided for the preventation and treatment of moderate acute malnutrition for 1,600 children and women. WFP's home fortification project supports 1,350 young children.
- WFP supports 11,850 school children through school feeding.
- In October 2016, WFP started a cash pilot and related Cash Impact Study in Otash.
- WFP has finalized SCOPE e-registration for protracted IDPs and 2013/14 new arrivals.
