PROVISION OF REQUESTED INFORMATION

Thank you for your request for information about a live animal export, which we received on 14 May 2017. Your request has been handled under the Freedom of Information Act 2000.

The information you requested and our response is detailed below:

“Under the Freedom of Information Act I would like to request information on a shipment of live animals that arrived at DOVER for export from the UK on 13/04/2017. I would like to request the details for the entire round trip of the vehicle including as to whether one lot of animals were imported and another lot exported during this transporters visit to the UK. The vehicle in question had the registration BZ-BX-67 for the tractor unit.

Please can you provide me with copies of the following paperwork (Please do not redact registration plates from any of this paperwork so that I can see it is connected to the vehicle above):

1. The Journey Log (WIT07)

Please see [Appendices 1 to 4 for the Journey Logs \(WIT07\)](#).

2. The Vehicle/Livestock Inspection Report (WIT32)

Following a search of our paper and electronic records, I have established that the information requested in part 2 is not held by APHA. This is because we did not carry out an inspection on this vehicle.

3. All Intra Trade Animal Health Certificates (ITAHC)

Please see [Appendices 5 to 8 for Intra Trade Animal Health Certificates \(ITAHC\)](#).

4. Any WIT08 or WIT09 notices served

Following a search of our paper and electronic records, I have established that the information requested in part 4 is not held by APHA. This is because we did not serve any WIT08 or WIT09 notices on this vehicle.

5. If any animals were refused loading, the ET45 form

Please see Appendix 9 for the only ET54 form for INTRA.GB.2016.0009375. The other ITAHCs did not have any animals rejected.

6. Any further documentation for this vehicle relating to the transportation of chicks in particular.

To search for information relating to this vehicle ever transporting chicks we would have to interrogate each individual ITAHC on record to establish whether the import/export involved this vehicle transporting poultry. In the year 2016 there were approximately 1800 exports for poultry alone.

Due to retention periods APHA only have information held relating to exports for 2 years and imports for 3 years.

Section 12(1) of the FOIA allows us to refuse a request for information if we estimate that the cost of complying with the request would exceed the appropriate limit, which currently stands at £600, and equates to 24 hours of staff time. On the basis of our estimates, we consider answering this part of your request would exceed this limit and, as such, we are refusing your request.

Please note there are no WIT07's, WIT32's (supervised loading at place of origin) and ET54 forms required for poultry export journeys.

You may wish to consider narrowing down this part of your request to focus more clearly on the precise information you are seeking. You could, for example:

- Request a specific date
- Specify a significantly short time period

If you were to make a new request for a narrower category of information, it may be that we could comply with that request within the appropriate limit, although we cannot guarantee that this will be the case.

Please could you also advise as to whether this vehicle received an inspection by Animal Health at the Port of Dover?”

APHA did not carry out an inspection on this vehicle at the port of Dover.

Information has been redacted under Section 38, Section 40(2) read in conjunction with 40(3)(a)(i) of the Freedom of Information Act (2000).

Section 38

Section 38 refers to the exemption from the duty to provide information if it would, or would be likely to affect anyone’s health or safety.

The exemption in Section 38 is subject to a Public Interest Test to ensure it is being appropriately applied.

Public Interest Test

We recognise that there is a general presumption in favour of transparency and openness concerning our work, and providing the general public with the right to request access to information held by public authorities.

We also recognise that there is a public interest in disclosure of this specific information in order to increase this transparency and aid well-informed debates concerning the welfare and transportation of animals, and the individuals associated with them.

However, we feel that there is a stronger public interest in withholding the information as the full addresses, including the county of origin, the destination and/or rest stops, transporter details and individual names would identify further information and would, or would be likely to, endanger the health and safety of staff. This poses a substantial risk to the health and safety of individuals associated with the transportation of animals that would be of significant severity and is likely to occur in some cases. We consider this to be a significant factor in favour of maintaining the exemption.

APHA has balanced the real threat to the health and safety of individuals which disclosure of the requested information would be likely to cause, against the public interest arguments in favour of disclosure. In this instance the APHA does not consider that disclosing the information requested in order to inform public debate and to promote accountability and transparency would justify the risk to individuals’ health and safety.

Section 40

Some of the information contained within the requested documents has been withheld under section 40(2) read in conjunction with 40(3)(a)(i) (third party personal data) of the FOIA as the information constitutes personal data relating to a third party. Section 40(2) read in conjunction with 40(3)(a)(i) of the FOIA provides that personal data relating to third parties is exempt information if disclosure would breach the Data Protection Act 1998 (DPA).

APHA consider that disclosure of this information is likely to breach the first data protection principle in Schedule 1 of the DPA, which relates to the fair and lawful processing of personal data, in two ways. First, disclosure would not constitute 'fair' processing of the personal data, second, disclosure would not satisfy any of the conditions for data processing set out in Schedule 2 to the DPA. Therefore, we have concluded that this information is exempt from disclosure under section 40(2) of the FOIA.

Information disclosed in response to this FOI request is releasable to the public. In keeping with the spirit and effect of the FOIA and the government's Transparency Agenda, this letter and the information disclosed to you may be placed on GOV.UK, together with any related information that will provide a key to its wider context. No information identifying you will be placed on the GOV.UK website.
