FREEDOM OF INFORMATION ACT 2000. MINISTRY OF DEFENCE POLICE: UNIFORM ACT ARRESTS

I refer to your e-mail of 14 September 2017, which was acknowledged on the 15 September 2017

We are treating your e-mail as a request for information in accordance with the Freedom of Information Act 2000 (FOIA 2000).

In your e-mail you requested the following information:

“I wanted to find out how many people have been arrested under the 1894 Uniforms Act, please? I am interested in arrests between January 1st 2012 – August 31st 2017 please?”

If you could break the data down by where the offence took place (e.g. town/ city) and what military uniform they were wearing (army, navy, RAF etc) I would be most grateful. Thank you.”

A search for information has now been completed and I can confirm that information in scope of your request is held by the Ministry of Defence Police. Please see below:-

How many people have been arrested under the 1894 Uniforms Act between January 1st 2012 – August 31st 2017?

One (1) person was arrested in 2012.

Where the offence took place

The Offence took place in Devon

What military uniform they were wearing

The person was wearing a Royal Navy uniform
