### Information request

"How many people have had their Job Seekers Allowance removed/suspended since June 2011 after failing to attend a mandatory work placement under the Work Programme?"

#### **DWP** response

I can confirm that the Department does hold some information falling within the description specified in your request. If a claimant fails to undertake any activity required as a condition of their participation on the Work Programme without good cause, then a doubt may be raised against their claim.

These doubts are recorded on the departments IT systems under the generic reason of 'Failed to Participate in Work Programme'. Information on the number of Jobseeker's Allowance (JSA) claimants who have been sanctioned for failing to attend a mandatory work placement is therefore not readily available and we estimate that the cost of complying with your request would exceed the appropriate limit of £600.

The appropriate limit has been specified in regulations and for central Government it is set at £600. This represents the estimated cost of one person spending 3½ working days in determining whether the Department holds the information, and locating, retrieving and extracting the information. Under section 12 of the Freedom of Information Act the Department is not obliged to comply with your request and we will not be processing your request further.
