PROVISION OF REQUESTED INFORMATION

Thank you for your request for information about the AI outbreak which we received on 8 March 2017. Your request has been handled under the Freedom of Information Act 2000.

The information you requested and our response is detailed below:

"Under FOI Act 2000 I seek the below information as held by APHA relating to the culling / disposal of birds infected with avian flu in February & March 2017:

- 1, For each of the following individual locations (SITES 1 2):
 - the approximate (or exact, if held) number of poultry birds culled following confirmation of avian flu at each premises
 - the method of killing at each premises e.g. killed onsite using "containerised gassing"; "whole house gassing"; "ventilation shutdown"; individual bird killing by neck dislocation, electrical stunning or other method; or birds sent for culling at a slaughterhouse
 - copies of any welfare records / observations made by APHA officials / vets or other official observers to the culling operations
 - the destination of carcasses of culled birds from each individual premises e.g for incineration or food processing
 - the number of poultry from individual premises (if any) sent to slaughterhouses for culling - and confirmation of whether meat from culled birds entered the food chain

SITE 1: Poultry premises near Redgrave, Suffolk (announced 13th Feb)

SITE 2: Poultry premises near Redgrave, Suffolk (announced 3rd March)"

Please see Appendices 1 to 3 for the record of on-farm culling of stock at the two sites, which includes observations made by APHA officials, vets or other official. These reports include the method of culling.

Remedial action is taken immediately if issues are identified.

Article 18 of Council Regulation (EC) 1099/2009 requires records to be kept of depopulation and any issues highlighted and sent back to the Commission. This ensures lessons learnt are cascaded to other Member States.

Please note these forms also include the numbers of poultry culled. This however may not have been a final figure recorded with APHA.

All birds have been humanely culled using the methods outlined in Annex 1 of the Welfare at Time of Killing (WATOK) Regulations.

All carcases from all sites were rendered at approved plants as a Category One Animal By Product.

No birds from any site were sent to slaughterhouse for culling.

Information has been redacted under Section 40(2) read in conjunction with 40(3)(a)(i) of the Freedom of Information Act (2000).

Section 40

Some of the information contained within the requested documents has been withheld under section 40(2) read in conjunction with 40(3)(a)(i) (third party personal data) of the FOIA as the information constitutes personal data relating to a third party. Section 40(2)

read in conjunction with 40(3)(a)(i) of the FOIA provides that personal data relating to third parties is exempt information if disclosure would breach the Data Protection Act 1998 (DPA).

APHA consider that disclosure of this information is likely to breach the first data protection principle in Schedule 1 of the DPA, which relates to the fair and lawful processing of personal data, in two ways. First, disclosure would not constitute 'fair' processing of the personal data, second, disclosure would not satisfy any of the conditions for data processing set out in Schedule 2 to the DPA. Therefore, we have concluded that this information is exempt from disclosure under section 40(2) of the FOIA.

Information disclosed in response to this FOI request is releasable to the public. In keeping with the spirit and effect of the FOIA and the government's Transparency Agenda, this letter and the information disclosed to you may be placed on GOV.UK, together with any related information that will provide a key to its wider context. No information identifying you will be placed on the GOV.UK website.



Test cull undertaken using both of two CGUs, 100% check on every bird for signs of life by vets as above. During cull constant monitoring of cull effectiveness by vets looking at ducks post gassing in drawers of modules

Oxygen monitors appeared to fail (did not show reducing oxygen levels) at about 10.30am Sunday 5/3/17. The module in the CGU at that time containing ducks for euthanasia was in mid stream of the culling process and was left in the unit for 5 minutes then taken out for inspection by the welfare at culling vets. They confirmed all ducks were showing no signs of life. The oxygen monitors and recording device were substituted by from for those known to be in good working order. There was a minor delay while these were installed and checked before normal service was resumed.

Comments

Numbers alive pre-cull calculated from birds placed as day olds less all daily casualty figures from farm records. At valuation visit on 3rd March (day before cull) all ducks appeared healthy and unaffected by disease. 'Normal' mortality recorded each day before the cull commenced totalled 75 ducks in total.

No evidence of any disease in birds alive each day before culling operations began.
