There are no significant judgements and estimates made by the management in the preparation of the financial statements.


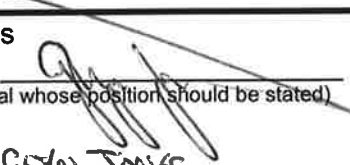
