
Online training resource available for the NHS Newborn and Infant Physical Examination

NHS Newborn and Infant Physical Examination Programme

The NHS Newborn and Infant Physical Examination Screening Programme (NIPE) sets standards to ensure all parents are offered the opportunity of a head to toe physical examination for their baby.

This examination is to check for problems or abnormalities within 72 hours of birth and again between six and eight weeks. It includes a general all over physical check, as well as specific screening elements which involve examination of the baby's eyes, heart hips and testes.

National implementation of the NIRE programme includes support for commissioners and providers to capture data, and to monitor and improve clinical practice, selvice performance and programme

delivery. This includes use of an IT system, such as NIYE's recommended Screening Management And Reporting Tool (NIKE SMART).
