Information request

I have been unable to establish if statistics exist that I require for my dissertation (in my final year of studying Children and Young People), where I am looking at the unemployment rate of young people who have a disability or additional need but are seeking employment.

Please can you advise if you have the following available?

Statistics 1: The number or percentage of:

- Young people aged 18 35 (or whatever banding you use for this type of young people description).
- · Classify themselves as having a disability.
- Seeking employment but currently in receipt of an unemployment benefit.

Statistics 2: The number or percentage of:

- Young People aged 18-35 (or whatever classification age bracket you categorise).
- Classify themselves as having a disability.
- Seeking employment but currently in receipt of unemployment benefit.
- Residing in the county of 'Northumberland', or if unable to locate this then the 'North East of England'.
