RE: Determination of the application for Llanbrynmair and Carnedd Wen Wind Farms

1 **OBJECT** to Carnedd Wen and Llanbrynmair windfarms.

Llanbrynmair and Carnedd Wen are close to each other, so the combined effect of both windfarms would be unacceptable in terms of visual, environment, habitat and "effectiveness". The tranquillity of the Welsh countryside is an important component of sustainable development. We have inherited the timeless beauty of these landscapes from our forebears and we recognise our duty to safeguard their serenity for future generations. If we progress with these two applications for even more on-shore commercial wind "farms", future generations will be amazed that we overwhelmed the landscape with such an inefficient and destructive response to reducing pollution.
