# MGN 577 (M+F)

## **Guidance on the Maintenance of Lists of Crew Ashore**

Notice to all Shipowners, Employers, Masters of Merchant Vessels and Skippers of Fishing Vessels

This note should be read with the Merchant Shipping (Crew Agreements, Lists of Crew and Discharge of Seamen)(Fishing Vessels) Regulations 1972 (S.I. 1972/919) as amended, and the Merchant Shipping (Crew Agreements, Lists of Crew and Discharge of Seamen) Regulations 1991 (S.I. 1991/2144) as amended by the Merchant Shipping (Maritime Labour Convention)(Consequential and Minor Amendments) Regulations 2014 (S.I. 2014/1614).

This note replaces MGN 111 (M+F) Maintenance of Crew Lists Ashore.

### **Summary**

This note advises shipowners, employers, masters of merchant vessels and skippers of fishing vessels of their obligations to maintain a List of Crew, including all changes, at an address in the United Kingdom.

These regulations do not apply to fishing vessels of less than 40 feet in length.

It also advises on the requirements to deliver on demand, a List of Crew to the Registrar-General of Shipping and Seamen.

Annex 1 provides the details to be specified in a List of Crew.

#### 1. Introduction

- 1.1 Regulation 15 of the Merchant Shipping (Crew Agreements, Lists of Crew and Discharge of Seamen) (Fishing Vessels) Regulations (S.I. 1972/919) (referred to as the "1972 Regulations) and Regulation 15 of the Merchant Shipping (Crew Agreements, Lists of Crew and Discharge of Seamen) Regulations 1991 (S.I. 1991/2144) (referred to as the "1991 Regulations") require that a copy of every List of Crew, including all changes notified to the shipowner should be maintained at an address in the United Kingdom.
- 1.2 Fishing vessels under 40 feet in length are not required to maintain a List of Crew.
- 1.3 The requirement for a List of Crew under the 1972 Regulations and the 1991 Regulations is separate from the IMO Crew List, known as FAL Form 5, which is required by port authorities



for immigration and customs reasons. There is nothing to prevent shipowners or companies creating a database or form which records the data for both purposes, but it should be capable of providing the information in the correct format for each purpose.

### 2. Maintaining a List of Crew Ashore

- 2.1 The master or skipper of any UK registered ship or fishing vessel should ensure that an up-to-date copy of the List of Crew is passed to the shipowner at the commencement of each voyage. The master or skipper is subsequently required, in addition to noting any changes of crew in the List of Crew carried on board, to notify, as soon as practicable and in any case within 3 days, the changes to the shipowner for entering in the List of Crew maintained ashore.
- 2.2 Only changes notified by the master or skipper may be entered into the List of Crew maintained ashore and it is important that the copy should be maintained in the form required as set out in Annex 1.
- 2.3 It is vital the copy of the List of Crew maintained ashore is to be kept up-to-date and that the details specified in Annex 1 are included since in the event of the loss or abandonment of the ship or fishing vessel to which it relates, it will be this which is used to establish whether any crew are missing. Certified extracts may also be required by the Registrar-General of Shipping and Seamen and may enable the death of a person on the vessel to be recorded to avoid any delay in settling their estate.
- 2.4 When a person has in their possession the copy of a List of Crew and has reason to believe the merchant ship or fishing vessel to which it relates has been lost or abandoned, they shall immediately hand the copy to any MCA Marine Office or send it by post to:-

## 3. Delivery of List of Crew to Registrar-General (Regulation 14, 1972 Regulations; Regulation 18, 1991 Regulations)

- 3.1 The shipowner or employer shall on demand, deliver to the Registrar-General of Shipping and Seamen within 28 days of such demand being made a List of Crew on board the ship at a date specified by the Registrar-General of Shipping and Seamen.
- 4. Duration of the List of Crew (Regulation 18, 1972 Regulations; Regulation 19, 1991 Regulations)
- 4.1 A List of Crew remains in force until all persons employed on the ship or fishing vessel, whose particulars are contained on the list have been discharged.
- 5. Delivery of List of Crew (Regulation 19 1972 Regulations; Regulation 20, 1991 Regulations)
- **5.1** The master must, within 3 days after a List of Crew has ceased to be in force, or if it is not practicable within that period, as soon as practicable thereafter, deliver the List of Crew to the Registry of Shipping and Seamen when the List of Crew ceases to be in force.



## 6. Production of Lists of Crew (Regulation 20, 1972 Regulations; Regulation 21, 1991 Regulations)

6.1 A master or skipper shall, on demand, produce to the Registrar-General of Shipping and Seamen, a superintendent, a surveyor of ships in the course of any inspection of the ship or fishing vessel or an officer of Revenue and Customs the List of Crew required to be maintained in ship or fishing vessel.

#### PARTICULARS TO BE SPECIFIED IN A LIST OF CREW

1. A List of Crew for merchant ships and fishing vessels shall contain the following particulars:-

a.

- the name of the ship or fishing vessel, it's official number and port of registry;
- ii. the name and address of the shipowner and any other person registered as manager or ship's husband;
- iii. [for fishing vessels, ships of traditional build and vessels not ordinarily engaged in comercial activities only] the number of the certificate evidencing an exemption granted by the Secretary of State from the requirements of section 25 of the Merchant Shipping Act 1995 (which relates to crew agreements) with respect to the ship or any person in it; and
- b. with respect to every seafarer from time to time on board the ship or fishing vessel whether or not they are employed under a seafarer employment agreement:
  - i. name and [for fishing vessels only] nationality;
  - ii. address:
  - iii. discharge book number (if any) or date and place of birth;
  - iv. the name of the ship or fishing vessel in which the seafarer was last employed, and if discharged from that ship more than 12 months before becoming employed in the ship to which the List of Crew relates, the year in which the seafarer was so discharged;
  - v. the capacity in which the seafarer is employed in the ship or fishing vessel:
  - vi. the grade, including all endoresments (e.g. Restrictions, Dangerous Cargo Endorsements), country of issue and number of any Certificate of Competency or Certificate of Equivalent Competency held by the seafarer;
  - vii. the date on which the seafarer first boarded the ship or fishing vessel to commence their employment in it:
  - viii. the date and place at which the seafarer left the ship or fishing vessel, and if they left on discharge, the reason for their discharge;
  - ix. if the seafarer is left behind otherwise than on discharge, the date and place of and reason (if known to the master or skipper) for this being done, and
  - x. the name, relationship and address (if different) to the seafarer's) of the seafarer's next of kin.

### **PROVIDED THAT:-**

- (1) A List of Crew which relates to a ship belonging to a general lighthouse authority contain only the particulars referred to in a (i) and b (i), (ii), (vi) and (viii).
- (2) With respect to a member of the naval, military or air forces of the Crown or of any service administered by the Defence Council when acting as such a member, a List of Crew need only contain the particulars referred to in b (i), (ii), (vii) and (viii).
