

Bracklesham Bay to Pagham Harbour Estate

England Coast Path: East Head to Shoreham by Sea - Natural England's Proposals

Understanding the proposals and accompanying maps:

The Trail:

- 2.1.1 Generally follows existing walked routes, including public rights of way and permissive paths, along most of this length.
- 2.1.2 Mainly follows the coastline quite closely and maintains good views of the sea.
- 2.1.3 Is aligned along the top of the perimeter bank around Medmerry, except for an area on the eastern side. This is to avoid an area of land set aside as a wildlife reserve to protect sensitive bird populations and to ensure that environmental land management objectives can succeed. See sections EHS-2-S005 to EHS-2-S010 and EHS-2-S018 to EHS-2-S024.
- 2.1.4 Is aligned on the beach or foreshore at Bracklesham Bay and Pagham Harbour. See sections EHS-2-S001 to EHS-2-S004 and EHS-2-S030 to EHS-2-S173.
- 2.1.5 Is aligned along the seawall at Selsey. See sections EHS-2-S055 to EHS-2-S086.

Protection of Sensitive Features:

- 2.1.6 This part of the coast includes the following sites, designated for nature conservation or heritage preservation (See map C of the Overview):
 - Pagham Harbour Special Protection Area (SPA)
 - Medmerry (this is a habitat creation scheme to provide compensation for losses of SAC and SPA intertidal habitat in the Solent area due to coastal squeeze. As such it should be treated as a

European Site)

- Pagham Harbour Ramsar site
- Bracklesham Bay Site of Special Scientific Interest (SSSI) for its geological /wildlife interest
- Pagham Harbour Site of Special Scientific Interest (SSSI) for its geological /wildlife interest
- Selsey East Beach Site of Special Scientific Interest (SSSI) for its geological interest
- Pagham Harbour Local Nature Reserve
- Ringwork south of St Wilfred's Chapel, Church Norton, Scheduled Ancient Monument (SAM).

We have assessed the potential impacts of access along the proposed route (and over the associated spreading room described below) on the features for which the affected land is designated and on any which are protected in their own right.

- 2.1.7 With input from specialists we have considered each of the sites involved and the relevant designations and conclude that for this section of the coast our proposals will not have a detrimental effect. In reaching this conclusion we took a number of factors into consideration, including existing and proposed management of these sites by the RSPB. These are discussed below (see 2.1.8 to 2.1.10).
- 2.1.8 We have proposed to exclude access all year-round to the seaward areas of the coastal margin at Medmerry Nature Reserve under s26(3)(a) of the Countryside and Rights of Way Act (2000). This is to prevent disturbance to wildlife. The exclusion does not affect the route itself and will have no legal effect on land where coastal access rights do not apply.
- 2.1.9 Directions to exclude access from the intertidal mudflats under section 25A have also been proposed at Medmerry and Pagham Harbour because we consider those areas to be unsuitable for public access. Whilst these directions are not designed to be mitigation measures for conservation concerns, they do exclude access from areas where such concerns might exist. If in the future these directions are no longer considered to be necessary, Natural England will consider the need for s26(3)(a) directions in their place. For details of these directions, see part 2.3 in the Formal Proposals section of this report and Part 10 of the Overview.
- 2.1.10 In addition to these measures, we have also identified a requirement to provide informal management measures, which include:
 - appropriate signage at key locations. These signs will explain the importance of these habitats, promote responsible dog behaviour and encourage people to stay on or close to the trail.
 - Making use of established, purpose built paths already in use.
 - Improvements to the surface of the trail itself which will encourage people to follow the designated route and therefore enhance access management.

In relation to those nature conservation sites listed above, refer to our published Access and Sensitive Features Appraisal for more information.

Accessibility:

2.1.11 Generally, there are few artificial barriers to accessibility on the proposed route, which makes use of existing surface paths wherever these meet the criteria in the Coastal Access Scheme.

However, there are places where it may not be entirely suitable for people with reduced mobility because:

■ The trail will follow an uneven and unconsolidated surface on sections of shingle beach.

At Halseys Farm, Sidlesham (sections EHS-2-S158 to EHS-2-S160), the trail can become wet and boggy along the public footpath through the field during periods of wet weather. It is intended that this section will be resurfaced as part of the physical establishment work described in part 7 of the Overview.

Where we have proposed exercising our discretion:

The discretions referred to below are explained in more detail in the Overview.

- 2.1.12 Estuary: This report proposes that the trail should contain sections aligned around the estuarial waters at Pagham Harbour, extending upstream from the open coast.
- 2.1.13 Landward boundary of the coastal margin: We have used our discretion on some sections of the route to map the landward extent of the coastal margin to an adjacent physical boundary such as a fence line, pavement or track to make the extent of the new access rights clearer. See Table 2.2.1.
- 2.1.14 In some places, we have used our discretion to propose the inclusion of additional, more extensive landward areas within the coastal margin. This is to secure or enhance public enjoyment of this part of the coast. The owners of this land are content for us to propose this.

See also part 3 of the Overview - 'Understanding the proposals and accompanying maps', for an explanation of the default extent of the coastal margin and how we may use our discretion to adjust the margin, either to add land or to provide clarity. See also Annex C of the Overview - 'Excepted land categories'.

- 2.1.15 Restrictions and/or exclusions: We have proposed to exclude access by direction under the Countryside and Rights of Way Act (2000) at both Medmerry and Pagham Harbour along this section of coast. For details of these directions, see 2.3.21 in the Formal Proposals Section of this chapter and Part 10 of the Overview.
- 2.1.16 Restrictions and/or exclusions: Access rights to the spreading room would be subject to the national restrictions on coastal access rights listed in Annex D of the Overview. These restrictions would not apply to public rights of way.

- 2.1.17 Optional alternative routes: We have identified one area on the length of coast covered by this chapter where an optional alternative route is required. This would not have the effect of creating any additional spreading room on either the seaward or landward side.
- 2.1.18 The optional alternative route would be available when the route along the foreshore at the south western entrance to Pagham Harbour at Church Norton is affected by high tides. It would follow an existing public footpath and be clearly waymarked. See map 2.h (sections EHS-2-S129 to EHS-2-S136) for more details.

Establishment and ongoing management of the trail:

2.1.19 Ongoing management and maintenance would be necessary in accordance with the general approach described in part 8 of the Overview. The overall need for this is likely to be greater than for some other parts of the stretch, recognising that it will be necessary for the route to roll back from time to time in response to coastal processes, as described below.

Future Change:

- 2.1.20 Part of the route of the trail on this length of coast would be able to change without further approval from the Secretary of State in response to encroachment by coastal erosion or other geomorphological processes, or encroachment by the sea. This would happen in accordance with the criteria and procedures for 'roll back' set out in part 9 of the Overview. See table 2.2.1 for details of the sections likely to be affected in the foreseeable future.
- 2.1.21 At the time of preparing the report, we do not foresee any other need for future changes to the access provisions proposed for the length of coast described in this chapter.

Notes on table:

Column 2 – an asterisk (*) against the route section number means see also table 2.2.2: Other options considered.

Column 5 - 'Yes - normal' means roll-back approach is likely to follow the current feature (e.g. cliff edge/beach) for the foreseeable future.

Column 5 – 'Yes – see table 2.2.1' means refer to that table about our likely approach to roll-back on this part of the route.

Column 6a - certain specific coastal land types are included automatically in the coastal margin where they fall landward of the trail, or connect indirectly with it by touching another part of the coastal margin that itself touches the foreshore at some point.

2.2.2 Alternative routes and optional alternative route details – Map(s) 2.a to 2.l: Bracklesham Bay to Pagham Harbour Estate

By default, the optional alternative route will cover the land two metres either side of the approved line for this route. However, by virtue of s55D(2) of the National Parks and Access to the Countryside Act 1949, where the optional alternative route follows an existing path corridor, the trail may adopt a variable width as dictated by existing physical features. Columns 6a and 6b of this table describe the boundaries of the alternative route strips.

Formal Proposals – Bracklesham Bay to Pagham Harbour Estate

Discretion to include an estuary

2.3.1 Natural England proposes to exercise its functions as if the sea included the estuarial waters around Pagham Harbour as indicated by the extent of the trail shown on map A2.

Proposed route of the trail

- 2.3.2 In relation to route sections EHS-2-S001 to EHS-2-S034 and EHS-2-S036 to EHS-2-S206 the route is to be at the centre of the line shown on maps 2a to 2l as the proposed route of the trail.
- 2.3.3 In relation to route section EHS-2-S035 upon low cliffs west of Selsey, the route, as initially determined at the time the report was prepared, is to be at the centre of the line shown on map 2e as the proposed route of the trail.
- 2.3.4 If at any time any part of a route section listed in the previous paragraph needs, in Natural England's view, to change as a result of coastal erosion or other geomorphological processes or encroachment by the sea in order to link with other parts of the route that need to roll back in direct response to such changes.
 - In order for the overall route to remain viable, the new route for the part in question will be determined by Natural England without further reference to the Secretary of State. This will be done in accordance with the criteria and procedures described under the title 'Roll-back' in part 9 of the Overview and section 4.10 of the Coastal Access Scheme. If this happens, the new route will become the approved route for that section for the purposes of the Order, which determines where coastal access rights apply.

Landward boundary of coastal margin

- 2.3.5 Adjacent to route sections EHS-2-S002 to EHS-2-S010 and EHS-2-S019 to EHS-2-S023, the landward boundary of the coastal margin is to coincide with the landward edge of the existing track as indicated by the coastal margin landward of the trail on maps 2a and 2b.
- 2.3.6 Adjacent to route sections EHS-2-S017 to EHS-2-S018, the landward boundary of the coastal margin is to coincide with the landward edge of the track shown as the trail on map 2c.
- 2.3.7 Adjacent to route sections EHS-2-S011 and EHS-2-S013 to EHS-2-S014 the landward boundary of the coastal margin is to coincide with the landward edge of the path as shown on maps 2b and 2c.
- 2.3.8 Adjacent to route section EHS-2-S024, the landward boundary of the coastal margin is to coincide with the landward edge of the track as shown on map 2d.

- 2.3.9 Adjacent to route sections EHS-2-S012, EHS-2-S015 and EHS-2-S016 the landward boundary of the coastal margin is to coincide with the landward edge of the road, as shown on maps 2b and 2c.
- 2.3.10 Adjacent to route sections EHS-2-S033 to EHS-2-S036, the landward boundary of the coastal margin is to coincide with the livestock perimeter fence which is landward of the trail shown on map 2e.
- 2.3.11 Adjacent to route section EHS-2-S037 the landward boundary of the coastal margin is to coincide with the landward edge of the pavement shown as the trail on map 2f.
- 2.3.12 Adjacent to route sections EHS-2-S047 and EHS-2-S048 the landward boundary of the coastal margin is to coincide with the wall, which is landward of the trail as shown on map 2f.
- 2.3.13 Adjacent to route sections EHS-2-S049 to EHS-2-S053, the landward boundary of the coastal margin is to coincide with the recreation ground's various boundary features, as indicated by the coastal margin landward of the trail on map 2f.
- 2.3.14 Adjacent to route section EHS-2-S054, the landward boundary of the coastal margin is to coincide with the wall which is landward of the multi-use route, shown as the trail on map 2f.
- 2.3.15 Adjacent to route sections EHS-2-S055 to EHS-2-S059, the landward boundary of the coastal margin is to coincide with various boundary features as indicated by the coastal margin landward of the trail on map 2f.
- 2.3.16 Adjacent to route sections EHS-2-S087 to EHS-2-S113, the landward boundary of the coastal margin is to coincide with the landward edge of the road shown as the trail on map 2g.
- 2.3.17 Adjacent to route sections EHS-2-S114 to EHS-2-S127, the landward boundary of the coastal margin is to coincide with various boundary features, which are landward of the trail as shown on map 2g and 2h.
- 2.3.18 Adjacent to route sections EHS-2-S138 to EHS-2-S139, the landward boundary of the coastal margin is to coincide with the hedge, which is landward of the public footpath shown as the trail on map 2h.
- 2.3.19 Adjacent to route sections EHS-2-S141 to EHS-2-S150, the landward boundary of the coastal margin is to coincide with various boundary features, which are landward of the public footpath shown as the trail on maps 2h and 2i.
- 2.3.20 Adjacent to route section EHS-2-S151 the landward boundary of the coastal margin is to coincide with the hedge bank which is landward of the existing walked route shown as the trail on map 2i.
- 2.3.21 Adjacent to route sections EHS-2-S152 to EHS-2-S156, the landward boundary of the coastal margin is to coincide with the landward edge of the road shown as the trail on map 2j.
- 2.3.22 Adjacent to route sections EHS-2-S157 to EHS-2-S158, the landward boundary of the coastal margin is to coincide with the fence line, which is landward of the public footpath shown as the trail on map 2j.
- 2.3.23 Adjacent to route sections EHS-2-S164 to EHS-2-S166, the landward boundary of the coastal margin is to coincide with the landward edge of the road shown as the trail on map 2.k.

- 2.3.24 Adjacent to route sections EHS-2-S169 to EHS-2-S170, the landward boundary of the coastal margin is to coincide with the hedge bank, which is landward of the trail shown on map 2.k.
- 2.3.25 Adjacent to route sections EHS-2-S174 to EHS-2-S206, the landward boundary of the coastal margin is to coincide with the landward edge of the road shown as the trail on map 2.l.

Local restrictions and exclusions

- 2.3.26 Natural England proposes to restrict or exclude access relevant to this length of coast, as follows:
 - Access is to be excluded all year-round to some areas of intertidal mud and saltmarsh on this length of coast at Pagham Harbour between EHS-2-S130 and EHS-2-S173. This exclusion is proposed under s25A of the Countryside and Rights of Way Act (2000) as the land is unsuitable for public access. This exclusion will not affect the route itself. See map F in the Overview for details.
 - Access is to be excluded all year-round to some areas of intertidal mud and saltmarsh on this length of coast at Medmerry Nature Reserve between EHS-2-S005 and EHS-2-S024. This exclusion is proposed under s25A of the Countryside and Rights of Way Act (2000) as the land is unsuitable for public access. This exclusion will not affect the route itself. See map E in the Overview for details.
 - Access is to be excluded all year-round at Medmerry Nature Reserve between EHS-2-S005 and EHS-2-S024 by direction under s26(3)(a) of the Countryside and Rights of Way Act (2000) to protect sensitive wildlife. The exclusion does not affect the route itself and will have no legal effect on land where coastal access rights do not apply. See map D in the Overview for further details.

Alternative routes

2.3.27 An optional alternative route is to operate at times when access to route sections EHS-2-S129 to EHS-2-S138 on the beach at Pagham Harbour is affected by high tides. The optional alternative route is to be at the centre of the line shown as route sections EHS-2-A001 to EHS-2-A009 as shown on map 2h.

Landward/seaward boundary of optional alternative route strip

- 2.3.28 In relation to route sections EHS-2-A001 to EHS-2-A002:
 - the landward boundary of the optional alternative route strip is to correspond to the landward edge of the path shown as the trail on map 2h; and
 - the seaward boundary of the optional alternative route strip is to correspond to the seaward edge of the path shown as the trail on map 2h.
- 2.3.29 In relation to route sections EHS-2-A003 to EHS-2-A004:
 - the landward boundary of the optional alternative route strip is to correspond to the landward edge of the track shown as the trail on map 2h; and

- the seaward boundary of the optional alternative route strip is to correspond to the seaward edge of the track shown as the trail on map 2h.
- 2.3.30 In relation to route sections EHS-2-A005 to EHS-2-A006:
 - the landward boundary of the optional alternative route strip is to correspond to the landward edge of the road shown as the trail on map 2h; and
 - the seaward boundary of the optional alternative route strip is to correspond to the seaward edge of the road shown as the trail on map 2h.
- 2.3.31 In relation to route sections EHS-2-A007 to EHS-2-A009:
 - the landward boundary of the optional alternative route strip is to correspond to the landward edge of the path shown as the trail on map 2.h; and
 - the seaward boundary of the optional alternative route strip is to correspond to the seaward edge of the path shown as the trail on map 2.h.




Map 2a: Bracklesham Bay to Marsh Farm, Medmerry






Map 2b: Marsh Farm, Medmerry to Greenwood Farm







Map 2c: Greenwood Farm to Great Ham Farm






Map 2d: Great Ham Farm to West Sands Caravan Park






Map 2e: West Sands Caravan Park to West Street






Map 2f: West Street to Selsey






Map 2g: Selsey to Park Copse






Map 2i: Church Norton to Ferry Farm, Siddlesham






