FREEDOM OF INFORMATION ACT 2000: MINISTRY OF DEFENCE POLICE: CAPITAL EXPENDITURE PROGRAMMES

We refer to your email dated 16 June 2017 which was acknowledged on the same day.

We are treating your email as a request for information in accordance with the Freedom of Information Act 2000 (FOIA 2000).

In your email you requested the following information:

"Please can you provide the force's three most recent annual capital expenditure programmes."

A search has been conducted and I can confirm that information within the scope of your request is held by the Ministry of Defence Police (MDP)

You will recall that we wrote to you on 6 July 2017, informing you that we would be completing a public interest test to determine whether we should release or withhold information. We have now completed the public interest test and concluded that balance favours releasing the information. Please see the below response.

"Please can you provide the force's three most recent annual capital expenditure programmes."

The last 3 capital expenditure programmes within the MDP are as follows:-

FY12/13 - £1.432m

FY13/14 - £0.636m

FY14/15 - £0.763m

All of the above relate to Vehicle procurement.

I apologise for the delay in responding to your request.

If you are not satisfied with this response or wish to complain about any aspect of the handling of your request, then you should contact me in the first instance. If informal resolution is not possible and you are still dissatisfied then you may apply for an independent internal review by contacting the Information Rights Compliance team, Ground Floor Zone D, MOD Main Building, Whitehall, London SW1A 2HB (email CIO-FOI-IR@mod.uk). Please note that any request for an internal review must be made within 40 working days of the date on which the attempt to reach informal resolution has come to an end.

If you remain dissatisfied following an internal review, you may take your complaint to the Information Commissioner under the provisions of Section 50 of the Freedom of Information Act. Please note that the Information Commissioner will not investigate the case until the MOD internal review process has been completed.
