**Request for Information**

Thank you for your email dated 6 March 2016 requesting information on the Multidisciplinary Framework Agreement (the Framework). For ease of reference your request is below.

With regards to the Multidisciplinary Services Framework (OJEU Reference No. 2014/S020-031462). Please could you provide me with the following information:

1. The annual spend through the framework.
  2. The number of clients who are currently using the framework.
  3. The name of those clients.
  4. The average spend per client.
1. The Framework commenced in November 2014, however the last update on spend that the Homes and Communities Agency (HCA) holds is up to December 2015. Therefore we can only report on one year spend, which is £21m for other public sector bodies and £7m for the HCA.
  2. We have 199 signed up Partners who can use the Property and Multidisciplinary Panels of which 36 have procured work through the Multidisciplinary Panel. Please note that Panel Members report their other public sector bodies usage to us on a quarterly basis so this is figure cannot be 100% accurate.
  3. We have provided you with a list of all signed up Partners in the spread sheet attached.
  4. The mean average spend, as requested, per client that has procured work is £574,349.096.
