Discretionary Housing Payments Government contribution for 2011/12

Introduction

This circular gives details of each local authority's (LA's) Government contribution and overall expenditure limit for Discretionary Housing Payments (DHPs) for 2011/12.

Background

- Since 2 July 2001, DHPs have allowed authorities to help those entitled to Housing Benefit (HB) or Council Tax Benefit (CTB) who, in their opinion, require further financial assistance with housing costs. The relevant regulations are the *Discretionary Financial Assistance Regulations 2001 [SI 2001/1167]*.
- The financial arrangements are covered in the *Discretionary Housing Payments (Grants) Order 2001*, which also came into effect on 2 July 2001 [SI 2001/2340] and covers
 - · how LAs should submit claims
 - how LAs are reimbursed for DHPs
 - that the overall limit on expenditure is set at 2.5x each authority's contribution from central Government
- In previous years, the DHP allocation has totalled £20m. The Government announced in the June 2010 budget that it will increase its contributions to LAs' funding for DHP by £10m to £30m in 2011/12.
- The Government plans to further increase the DHP allocation to a total of £60 million for the 2012/13 allocation. The method for this allocation will be considered at a later stage.
- The purpose of the additional funding is to provide LAs with more flexibility to help a greater number of new and existing customers who face a shortfall in rent because of changes to HB which come into effect from April 2011.

Distribution of the Government contribution and upper limit for 2011/12

- 7 The distribution formula is intended, as far as possible, to target resources according to need.
- As in previous years, we have used the current formula to allocate the original £20m. Each authority's allocation is based on the mid-point between its DHP spend for the latest year for which we have reliable data and its contribution for that year.

- 9 So, for example, if the LA had a contribution of £5,000 and spent £4,000, it would be allocated £4,500. And if it had spent £7,000, it would be allocated £6.000.
- The remaining £10m has been allocated differently and is based upon the Department for Work and Pensions' estimates of the total gross reductions in HB entitlement in each LA.
- 11 Following discussions with the local authority associations (LAAs), the overall allocation for each LA has been adjusted to ensure that no LA is allocated less in 2011/12 than they were in 2010/11. This adjustment has been performed using the same methodology as the 'netting' process used in the calculation of Administration Subsidy.

Note: 'Netting' is the process that ensures an LA will not lose more than a certain percentage of their previous year's DHP allocation.

Appendix A shows each authority's allocation and upper spending limit for 2011/12 based on the methodology agreed with the LAAs. This methodology will be reviewed again for 2012/13.
