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## 1. Introduction

### 1.1 Purpose

This FE Choices Learner Satisfaction open data guidance describes the formatting and content of the Open Data files for Learner Satisfaction.

## 2. File Contents

### 2.1 Files Published

- Provider File - Displays summary information relating to the provider, such as the provider's overall score and comparison scores. Where data is not available, the file also contains missing score reason codes.
- Response File - Displays the number of survey responses and the number of learners for each provider by age range and analysis group.
- Question File - Displays the individual question scores for each provider by age range and analysis group.

## 3 Suppression

### 3.1 Purpose

To protect the identity of individual learners participating in the survey we have had to suppress some of the values in the files. Where this is the case the "-" character is used instead of the original value. We do this to make sure no individual learning at a particular provider can be identified from the data we release.

Suppression is required in statistical publications to protect the possible identification of individuals' identities and thereby ensure compliance with the Data Protection Act.
