### Origin and Activities

The International Transport Workers' Federation (ITF) is a global organisation of transport workers' unions. It was formed in 1896 by European seafarers' and dockers' unions and a few years later joined by unions representing railway, road transport and later civil aviation workers. The ITF provides a range of services for its affiliates under the headings of organising solidarity, co-ordinating the common interests of transport workers, representing them to international organisations and informing and advising unions about developments in the transport industry. The ITF is dedicated to the support and development of strong and democratic transport workers' unions worldwide. The ITF also runs a number of specialised industrial campaigns with specific objectives, of which the largest is the campaign against the transfer of ships to Flags of Convenience (FOC) to evade national laws and national unions.

The member unions run the ITF. In 2015 there were 684 affiliates in 147 countries representing over 4.7 million workers. The main policy making body is the Congress, which meets every four years, and to which all affiliates can send voting delegates. The Congress elects a General Secretary who is responsible for the administration of the ITF Secretariat. The Congress also elects a President and five Vice Presidents from among the members of the Executive Board elected by the Congress. This Executive Board meets twice a year and is responsible for the conduct of ITF affairs between Congresses. It maintains regional offices in Europe, the Americas, Arab World, Asia Pacific and Africa.

### Financial Report

The financial statements have been prepared in accordance with applicable United Kingdom Generally Accepted Accounting Policies including Financial Reporting Standard 102 (FRS102). This is the first year in which the financial statements have been prepared under FRS102 and note 26 to the accounts contains an explanation of the transition. In addition to the ITF statement of income and retained earnings, statement of financial position and cash flow statement, the organisation produces separate income and expenditure statements representing separately funded activities which are included in the notes to the financial statements. The General Fund income is derived from membership fees from affiliated unions. General Fund expenses relate to the general administration of the Headquarters and Regional offices and the activities of the non-maritime industrial sections. These activities include the costs of organising meetings and conferences and the cost of publications and research. The Seafarers' International Assistance, Welfare and Protection Fund (Welfare Fund) income arises from welfare contributions and crew membership fees which are generated from ITF acceptable collective agreements for ships flying Flags of Convenience entered into by the ITF and its affiliates on behalf of seafarers with ship owners. There is also some investment income arising from investments managed on behalf of the Fund during 2015 by

BlackRock Investment Managers and Integrated Financial Arrangements plc (Transact). BlackRock ceased to manage investments on behalf of the ITF in December 2015. Expenditure from the Welfare Fund covers ITF Maritime activities, the ITF campaign against Flags of Convenience and an agreed proportion of general ITF infrastructure and core activity costs. A donation by way of gift aid is made each year to the ITF Seafarers' Trust, a UK charity which exists to provide for the welfare of Seafarers of all nations.

The following paragraphs describe the significant events during 2015.

#### **General Fund**

Income from Affiliation fees for the year end 31 December 2015 amounted to £5.645 million (2014 £5.354 million). Total income for the year amounted to £6.141 million (2013 £5.882 million) including £489k of donor funding for Education Projects received from external solidarity organisations and affiliates. Total expenditure for the year amounted to £5.689 million (2014 £5.647 million). The General Fund net surplus, after the transfer to the Congress Fund but before allowing for pension scheme adjustments was £202k (2014 £235k). The General Fund share of the pension scheme deficit, calculated according to UK accounting standards, decreased during 2015 from £2.759 million to £2.731 million and pension scheme adjustments of £344k including actuarial gains have been reflected in the Income & Expenditure account for the year. The net movement in funds was an increase of £546k (2014 reduction £706k) decreasing the deficit on General Fund unallocated funds at 31 December 2015 to £2.673 million (31 December 2014 deficit £3.219 million). Note 26 details the restatement of prior year figures following the implementation of United Kingdom Generally Accepted Accounting Policies including Financial Reporting Standard 102 in January 2015.

The International Solidarity Fund was established within the General Fund to provide for direct financial assistance to affiliates facing serious financial crisis for example as a result of attacks by governments, employers or anti-union bodies. Income and expenditure on this fund were £23k and £24k respectively during the year leaving the balance at the end of the year at £9k (2014 £8k)

#### Seafarer's International Assistance, Welfare and Protection Fund (Welfare Fund)

The Welfare Fund receives the bulk of its income in US dollars and its payments, particularly for Inspectorate costs, are made in a variety of currencies including US Dollars, Euros and Japanese Yen as well as Sterling. The income and expenditure which is shown in Sterling can be subject to significant variations from year to year due to movements on the world currency markets.

Payments by ship owners in respect of Welfare Fund contributions and crew membership fees increased from £34.03 million in 2014 to £37.7 million in 2015 benefitting from the strength of the US dollar as the majority of agreements are paid in US dollars. In the same period, £2.977million (2014 £2.085 million) of welfare contributions from International Bargaining Forum collective agreements have been contributed to the IBF Welfare Fund. This fund is independent of the ITF and is used exclusively for seafarers employed on the ships covered by IBF agreements to provide benefits such as on board welfare facilities, crew communications and assistance or support for crew members' families. ITF representatives are included on the board of the IBF Welfare Fund together with representatives of maritime employers' organisations.

Investment income, including realised capital gains/losses amounted to £1.041 million (2014 £986k)

Total Welfare Fund income for the year from all these sources amounted to £38.896 million (2014 £35.180 million).

Total expenses were £33.927 million (2014 £41.189 million). Gift Aid to the ITF Seafarers' Trust in 2015 was £1.2 million and the 2014 figure of £11.1 million included a one off £10 million donation. The largest single item of operational expenditure during 2015 involves the cost of the ITF inspectorate, amounting to £11.607 million (2014 £11.298 million). The total number of inspectorates at the end of 2015 was 74. Foreign exchange losses amounting to £54k (2014 £918k) arose largely from the year end revaluation of

the Fund's Dollar and Euro cash balances. The operating net surplus on the Welfare Fund for the year was  $\pm 4.719$  million (2014 Surplus of  $\pm 2.959$  million before one off gift aid donation of  $\pm 10$  million.)

The portion of the deficit on the ITF Retirement Benefits Scheme attributable to the Welfare Fund decreased from £10.834 million at 31 December 2014 to £10.629 million at 31 December 2015. Pension adjustments including actuarial losses reflected in the Income & Expenditure account totalled £1.374million credit (2014 £4.015 million charge). After allowing for the increase in the market value of the investments and the FRS 102 pension adjustments, the net movement in funds was £7.578 million surplus (2014 £7.338 million deficit). The net assets of the Welfare Fund at 31 December 2015 were £89.909 million (2014 £82.354 million). Note 26 details the restatement of prior year figures following the implementation of United Kingdom Generally Accepted Accounting Policies including Financial Reporting Standard 102 in January 2015.

The value of the ITF's investment portfolio increased from £68.7 million at the beginning of the year to £75.7 million at the year end. This included a transfer of £5 million from cash holdings to increase the world equity holdings. There was a realised gain on investment disposals during the year of £280k and an unrealised gain on the revaluation of the investment portfolio at the year end of £1.2 million giving a total of £1.48 million. The ITF Investment Sub Committee's decision to adopt a systematic (Index) methodology and to move away from active management was discussed and endorsed at the October 2015 Executive Board meeting in Chennai. The re-registration of the existing BlackRock funds onto the Transact platform was completed in the final quarter of 2015. The cash holdings in the same period reduced from £18 million to £14 million but cashflow remained healthy and two major transfers were made to long term assets during the year. As mentioned, £5 million was transferred from cash holdings to the long term investment portfolio and secondly, the sum of £5.86 million was invested in the Empire Square apartments. A further £4.2 million was transferred to the ITF Seafarers' Trust comprising gift aid of £1.2 million and an interest free loan of £3 million.

#### **Congress Fund**

The sum of £500k was transferred to the Congress fund in 2015. Further allocations will be made in future years towards the cost of the 44th ITF Congress to be held in August 2018.

#### **Tangible fixed assets**

The most significant addition to fixed assets in the year was the purchase of 7 residential properties using funds set aside for long term investment and after taking appropriate professional advice. The ITF is a global organisation and needs to accommodate the increasing number of affiliates who travel to the London headquarters for training or on secondment. The purchase is intended to support the ITF's operating needs whilst providing a good long term investment of its funds.

The costs of the properties are reflected in the fixed asset note 13 to the accounts.

#### Pension scheme

The Federation operates a defined benefits pension scheme, the ITF Retirement Benefits Scheme. The scheme funds are administered by trustees and are independent of the Federation's finances. Benefits under the scheme are based on employees' final remuneration and length of service. The pension cost is assessed in accordance with the advice of an independent qualified actuary. The last full actuarial valuation carried out at 1 January 2014 revealed a surplus in the scheme of £50,000.

During the financial year employer's contributions receivable from the ITF were paid at the rate of 23.3% of pensionable salaries with a corresponding contribution rate of 8% for employees.

The FRS 102 pension liability is calculated using a different basis than the triennial actuarial valuation. The defined benefit costs and pension scheme deficit have been apportioned between the funds on the basis of

the estimated proportion of pension costs applicable to each fund and are disclosed in full in note 25 on page 23 to the accounts.

#### Statement of Executive Board Members' Responsibilities

#### **Accounting policies**

The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention, and are in accordance with applicable accounting standards including Financial Reporting Standard 102 (FRS102). This is the first year in which the financial statements have been prepared under FRS102 and note 26 to the accounts contains an explanation of the transition. The following principal accounting policies have been applied.

#### a) Foreign currency

Foreign currency transactions are translated at the rates ruling when they occur. Foreign currency assets and liabilities are translated into sterling at the rates of exchange ruling at the statement of financial position date. Any differences are taken to the statement of income and retained earnings.

#### b) Affiliation fees receivable

- (i) Affiliation fees are accounted for on a receivable basis.
- (ii) The Federation's Constitution allows affiliates, in certain circumstances, to request that their annual fee be calculated at concessionary rates and this procedure has been applied during 2015. The total amount of affiliation fees receivable shown in the statement of income and retained earnings does not, therefore, represent the total amount due on reported membership calculated at the standard affiliation fee rate.
- c) Welfare contributions and crew membership fees

On signing an ITF agreement with an ITF affiliate, a ship owner:

- (i) undertakes to make a yearly welfare contribution per head in advance;
- (ii) if appropriate, arranges for the crew to become members of the Special Seafarers' Department; and
- (iii) remits the appropriate membership fees on their behalf.

Such contributions and fees are voluntary and are paid direct by the ship owners or collected by affiliated unions. In view of the uncertainty associated with the receipt of the income, it is deemed appropriate to recognise the income upon receipt.

#### d) Investment income

Interest on fixed interest investments is accrued on a receivable basis; dividends on equities are brought into account when received.

#### e) Administration charge

A proportion of the General Fund's employment and other administration costs have been charged to the Seafarers' International Assistance, Welfare and Protection Fund and the ITF Seafarers' Trust, over and above directly incurred expenditure, to reflect the activity carried out on their behalf by employees paid from the General Fund.

#### f) 'Taxation

For United Kingdom taxation purposes, the Federation is treated as an unincorporated association and assessed to corporation tax on both its investment income and any net gains on the disposal of investments. The ITF mitigates its taxable income by way of Gift Aid to the ITF Seafarers' Trust, a registered charity.

#### g) Pension Scheme FRS 102

The Federation operates a defined benefits contributory pension scheme open to all UK based employees of the ITF. The scheme is independent of the ITF and is administered by Trustees. Pension scheme costs and liabilities are reflected in these financial statements in accordance with the requirements of FRS 102. Scheme costs and liabilities have been apportioned between the General Fund and the Welfare Fund in accordance with the allocation of pensionable salaries between the funds including the administration charge.

#### h) Fixed Assets and Depreciation

All assets, including land and buildings are included in the Financial Statements at cost. Additions totalling over £10,000 are capitalised.

Furniture and equipment, computer systems and motor vehicles are fully depreciated on a straight-line basis over three to ten years. Property is depreciated at 2 percent per annum on a straight-line basis.

#### i) Investments

Investments are stated at fair value. Unrealised and realised investment gains and losses are shown in the Statement of Income and Retained Earnings.

#### j) Provision for liabilities

Provisions are recognised when the Federation has a present obligation (legal or constructive) as a result of a past event, it is probable that the Federation will be required to settle the obligation, and a reliable estimate can be made of the amount of the obligation.

The amount recognised as a provision is the best estimate of the consideration required to settle the present obligation at the end of the reporting period, taking into account the risks and uncertainties surrounding the obligation.

The Federation recognises a provision for annual leave accrued by employees as a result of services rendered in the current period, and which employees are entitled to carry forward and use within the next 12 months. The provision is measured at the salary cost payable for the period of absence.

#### k) Key judgements and uncertainties

In preparing these financial statements to conform to generally accepted accounting principles and by applying the Federation's accounting policies, management are required to use judgements in applying estimates and assumptions which affect the reported amounts. The items in the financial statements where these judgements and estimates have been made include:

(i) Defined Benefit Pension Scheme – Management engage with an actuarial team, see note 25 for more details.

#### L) Financial Instruments

The Federation only has financial assets and financial liabilities of a kind that qualify as basic financial instruments. Basic financial instruments are initially recognised at transaction value and subsequently measured at their settlement value, representing amortised cost as follows.

#### 23. Capital commitments

In September 2015 ITF entered into a contract with Temple Lifts to replace the two passenger lifts at ITF House in the amount of £156k, of which £112k was incurred before the year end.

In November 2015 entered into a contract with iSYS Data Solutions to undertake an IT Infrastructure Strategy Review in the amount of £15,000.

#### 24. Contingent Liability

The 2011 ITF balance sheet contained a liability of £4,093,755 for crew back pay and compensation awaiting distribution plus an associated liability of £1,900,000 provision for interest on back pay. The source of the funds was unclaimed back pay recovered on behalf of seafarers and many of the balances dated back decades. Following a technical review of the balances the ITF believes that it was holding the balances as agent on behalf of the seafarers and that the liability for the back pay and corresponding cash balances should not appear in the ITF's balance sheet. However, the ITF acknowledges an ongoing liability to pay out a backpay claim plus interest to any seafarer or their dependent who can establish a reasonable case to show that funds had been received on their behalf by the ITF. \$3k was paid during 2015 relating to a claim from the late 1990s.

#### **International Transport Workers' Federation**

#### 25. Pension

The Federation operates a defined benefits pension scheme, the ITF Retirement Benefits Scheme. The scheme funds are administered by trustees and are independent of the Federation's finances. Benefits are based on employees' final remuneration and length of service. The pension cost is assessed in line with the advice of an independent qualified actuary on the basis of an annual valuation and charged to the Statement of Income and Retained Earnings..

The FRS 102 figures are based on the results of the full actuarial valuation of the Scheme as at 1 January 2014 and updated to 31 December 2015 using assumptions which are consistent with the requirements of FRS 102. In order to reflect the requirements of FRS 102 separately in the General and Welfare Funds the defined benefit costs and the pension scheme deficit have been apportioned between the funds on the basis of the estimated proportion of pension costs applicable to each fund.

#### 26. Transition to FRS102 - reconciliations

ITF has adopted United Kingdom Generally Accepted Accounting Policies including Financial Reporting Standard 102 for the year ended 31 December 2015 and has restated the comparative prior year amounts.

#### **Explanation**s

a) Holiday pay accrual

The 2014 Headquarters staff cost now recognises a provision for holiday pay accrued but not taken of £189k (2013; £144K). The equivalent provision at 31 December 2015 is £125k.

b) Change in recognition of defined benefit plan finance costs

The net pension finance cost recognised in the Income and Expenditure account for the year ended 31st December 2015 under the previous UK GAAP was the net of the expected return on pension plan assets and the interest on pension liabilities. FRS 102 requires the recognition in the Statement of Income and Retained Earnings, of a net interest cost, calculated by multiplying the net plan obligations by the market yield on high quality corporate bonds (the discount rate applied). The change has had no effect on net assets as the measurement of the net defined benefit plan obligation has not changed. Instead, the decrease in the surplus for the year has been mirrored by a reduction in the actuarial losses presented within Other Comprehensive Income.
