Thank you for your e-mail dated 11 November 2017 received under the terms of the Freedom of Information Act 2000. The specific details of your request have been extracted from your email and are highlighted in bold within the body of this letter.

In response to your Freedom of Information request –

How much money has Dartford Crossing made over the course of the one-year period between November 1, 2016 and October 31, 2017?

The Dartford Accounts dated from 2002 through until 2016 are available via <https://www.gov.uk/government/publications> searching 'Dartford Accounts' in the search box. The most recent accounts published in January 2017 cover the period from when Dart Charge was introduced in November 2014 to March 2016 and include revenue from enforcement action. The next Dartford accounts covering 2016/17 will be published in due course. All revenues from the Dartford Crossing are passed to the Government, and are ring-fenced for transport projects.

In keeping with the spirit and effect of the legislation, all information is assumed to be releasable to the public unless exempt. We may therefore be publishing the information you requested, together with any related information that will provide a key to its wider context, via the Gov.uk website.
