Thank you for your email of 16 January 2017 requesting the following information:

"An up to date list of all contactors, sub-contractors and suppliers that have or will be involved with the building project at the Defence & National Rehabilitation Centre/Stanford Hall"

I am treating your correspondence as a request for information under the Freedom of Information Act 2000 (FOIA).

A search for the information has now been completed within the Ministry of Defence (MOD) and I can confirm that some information in scope of your request is held but is covered by Section 21 of the Act (information reasonably accessible by other means). Under Section 16 of the Act (Advice and Assistance) you may find it helpful to note that Stanford Hall is not due to be handed over to the MOD until April 2018 and the construction project is currently managed by Black Stork Charity UK. If you are not satisfied with this response or you wish to complain about any aspect of the handling of your request, then you should contact us in the first instance at the address above. If informal resolution is not possible and you are still dissatisfied then you may apply for an independent internal review by contacting the Information Rights Compliance team, Ground Floor, MOD Main Building, Whitehall, SW1A 2HB (e-mail CIO-FOI-IR@mod.uk). Please note that any request for an internal review must be made within 40 working days of the date on which the attempt to reach informal resolution has come to an end.

If you remain dissatisfied following an internal review, you may take your complaint to the Information Commissioner under the provisions of Section 50 of the Freedom of Information Act. Please note that the Information Commissioner will not normally investigate your case until the MOD internal review process has been completed.
