A search for information has now been completed and I can confirm that information in scope of your request is held by the Ministry of Defence Police (MDP). Please see below:-

1. What Case Management System you use

The MDP use UNIFI Crime and Intelligence system.

2. What database the Case Management System uses (i.e. Access, Oracle, Marine DB etc.)

UNIFI uses an Oracle database

3. How many cases where logged between the years 2015-2017

The MDP logged 1984 new cases on UNIFI during the time period specified.(up unitl and including 31 October 2017)

4. How many users are currently using the Case Management System within the force.

All police officers within the MDP have access to UNIFI. Currently there are 2551 officers in Force.
