Failure to comply with any of the conditions of this agreement or any applicable general licence under which the above animals are moved may render a person liable to criminal prosecution and heavy penalties on conviction. It may also result (a) in this authority being revoked (b) in a prohibition notice being served under the above Order preventing you from moving animals under general licence and/or (c) in the future applications for Exemptions and/or movement licences being refused.

Criteria for Interim Land Association Management agreement

- A boundary of land in the Interim Land Association Management (ILAM) must be within ten miles of the boundary of the main farm premises
- The holder (a livestock keeper) must be sole occupier of the premises concerned
- no nose to nose contact with cattle in adjacent herds
- Premises may be rented, from a landlord who is the nominal occupier in Rural Payments Wales (RPW) terms, but if so, operations must be demonstrably separate from any landlord's activities
- Although Disease Control Order (DCO) standstills do not apply, movement reporting and recording imperatives remain in place and hence premises must be suitably identified. All movements, including internal ones, are subject to the conditions of appropriate species DCO General Licence to move cattle, sheep, goats, pigs. During internal movements, animals must not have contact with other Foot and Mouth (FMD) susceptible livestock that are not within the ILAM holder's sole control. Movement across land, including fields, where the ILAM holder does not have sole control over all FMD susceptible animals is not permitted.
